SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

We continue to pray for the 93 children of our Partnered Parishes who received the Sacrament of Confirmation at St Patrick's Cathedral last Thursday 28th.

Archbishop Comensoli invited parishes to have Confirmation at the Cathedral in this Jubilee Year, so our three schools and our catechetics class took up this invitation in a combined celebration.

Due to Archbishop Ireland's transfer to Hobart, Fr Ford was celebrant of the Sacrament, by special delegation from Archbishop Peter Comensoli.



Next Sunday 7th September, Pope Leo XIV will canonise Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati as Saints - Pope Leo's first canonisations.

(These canonisations were scheduled earlier, but were postponed because of the death of Pope Francis.)

- Bl. Carlo Acutis (1991-2006) will be the first saint belonging to the 'millennial' generation. Born in London of Italian parents, he grew up in Milan. Although his parents were not religious, he developed a special love for the Eucharist, even creating a website documenting Eucharistic miracles. He died of leukemia aged 15, and was beatified on 10 October 2020. Feast: 12 October
- Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-25) lived in Turin. The outstanding feature of his faith was his help for those in need and commitment to social action. He died of polio aged 24, and was beatified on 20 May 1990. Feast: 4 July

Both have already become prominent models of faith for youth and young adults. Next Sunday, the day of their canonisation, we will look at their lives in more depth.

Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving Homeless People with Mental III Health

The experience of people living with the challenges of homelessness and mental ill-health has been highlighted in the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference's 2025 Social Justice Statement.

Each year since 1940, the Conference has released a statement for reflection and discussion ahead of Social Justice Sunday on a key issue in Australian society.

This year's statement is Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving People Living in Homelessness and Mental III -Health.

Australia is facing a deepening crisis. Over 273,000 people sought help from homelessness services last year, many also struggling with mental illness. Services are overstretched and many people are left without care, shelter, or hope. Many who are homeless also live with serious mental health challenges. Services are overwhelmed, and too many people are left without the help they desperately need.

This year's Social Justice Statement calls us to follow the example of Jesus, who always noticed, listened to, and cared for those on the edge of society. Just as Jesus healed the blind man Bartimaeus (*Mark 10:46–52*), we are called to see and respond to the needs of our brothers and sisters living in hardship.

The statement shares powerful stories of real people: Michael, who found new life through care and community after years on the street and battling depression; Sally, who faced deep loneliness and an impersonal health system; Carol, who became

homeless at 67 after losing her husband; and Luis, who quietly bore his suffering with dignity. These stories show the human face of homelessness and mental illness. They remind us that everyone has a name and a story, and that everyone deserves to be seen, heard, and loved.

The Church must become more and more a place of encounter, where people are not just helped, but befriended and embraced as equals. We must notice those on the edge, truly get to know them, and walk with them in love. The Bishops call for practical action: more affordable housing, better mental health services, stronger support systems, and an end to policies that leave people behind.

But above all, they call on each of us to respond with compassion, courage, and hope. This is not just the work of professionals or institutions.

Every Christian is called to step into the lives of those who are suffering, to befriend them, advocate for them, and journey alongside them.

"The Eucharist commits us to the poor... you have tasted the blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognise your brother." – *St John Chrysostom*

In this Jubilee Year 2025, we remember that we are "Pilgrims of Hope." As members of the Pilgrim Church, let us bring healing, dignity, and hope. Let us walk with those who are homeless and mentally unwell, not just as service providers, but as neighbours and friends.

'Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.' (Lk 14:11)

In our gospel today, Jesus speaks of the virtue of humility; and of pride, its opposing vice. Pride is named first of the seven 'capital' or 'deadly' sins — those attitudes of heart that are the source of other sins.

From one perspective, pride is the worst of all sins, because in its pure form of 'desiring to be first of all', of its very nature it makes us resent and reject God's rule over us; it leads us to want total independence, to be subject to no one.

Not all pride has this absolute nature. But we recall that it was pride that led the evil angels, the demons, to fall from the original goodness in which God created them. We can also see the work of pride in the sin of our first parents, Adam and Eve.

Humility defeats pride by acknowledging the truth about ourselves. We are not 'first of all beings' — we are created by God and subject to him. All the good we have (including the good of our virtuous free actions) has its complete and first source in him alone. And obviously we are not 'higher' than our fellow human beings: we are all created equal by nature, and we should think of and relate to each other with this in mind.

All of us are blends of strengths and weaknesses, virtues and sins. Humility recognises our own sins (and ourselves as their primary source), while referring all our good qualities back to God's gift.

But especially, it leads us not to focus overly on *ourselves* at all. We are not the centre of the universe. It is truer humility to genuinely listen to another person than to hold forth on how terrible we are. So pride gazes inward at self, but humility turns outward to others.
