Opened in 1969, West Beach Primary School is a vibrant community school located in the beach side suburbs of Adelaide.


We are a small to medium sized school with excellent facilities including extensive grounds, a swimming pool and quality IT facilities.

#### **Out of School Hours Care**

It has been a successful year with enrolment s gradually increasing throughout the year in both After School Care and Vacation Care. As a result, extra staff has been appointed to cater for the increased demand. The program has a very supportive team who strive to achieve the best outcomes for the participants.

Our OSHC service was re-assessed in September with results indicating a clear improvement in numerous Quality Standards since the first assessment and rating visit in 2013. The service was acknowledged for its positive relationship with the school and for providing supportive outcomes for all children attending the service.

After extensive consultation with the school community, Governing Council has decided to commence Before School Care from the start of the 2015 school year on a 'trial basis'. The service will operate for one hour each morning from 7:30am. The attendance of this programme will be closely monitored.

#### **Information Communication Technology**

2014 has seen significant progress in the area of Information Communication Technology (ICT) with the appointment of Tina Nesbitt as the ICT co-ordinator.

The main focus of this co-ordinator role in 2014 has been on working alongside classroom teachers R-7 to enhance the capacity of teachers to embed ICT into their daily teaching practice and to integrate the use of ICT across all curriculum areas.

Class sets of Ipads have been purchased during the year with several classes trialling the use of these Ipads throughout the second semester. These trials have proved very successful and it is intended that these trials will be extended further in 2015.

A significant upgrade to the Resource Centre is scheduled to occur during the end of year holidays with out-dated desktop computers due to be replaced with a suite of new Apple Mac Book laptop computers.


Work is continuing on the development of a longer-term ICT plan which will enable West Beach Primary School to systematically upgrade our ICT resources in order to support improved teaching and learning.

#### **Attendance**



Whilst there has been an improvement in attendance rates in years 2-3, there has been a decline in the overall attendance rate from 93.1% to 91.3% in 2014, largely as a result of a decline in attendance rates in years R-1 and 5-7.

Student attendance rates will be a significant focus in 2015 to ensure that the overall attendance rates for students R-7 at West Beach Primary School exceed the DECD Attendance Target of 93%.




### **Literacy – Running Records**

2014 Running Records – Year 1 compared to State




Running Records reading data indicates that Year 1 student s at West Beach Primary School have achieved above the state average reading levels with 47.8% of our students reading at levels 21-26 and no students achieving results in the five lowest reading levels.





Running Records reading data indicates that Year 2 student s at West Beach Primary School have achieved well above the state average reading levels with nearly 83% of our students reading at levels 21-26 and no students achieving results in the ten lowest reading levels.

25% of students in year 2 achieved Running Records level 30 by the end of the year in 2014.



## **Improvement Priorities** cont. **Literacy and Numeracy - NAPLAN**

Writing results at years 3,5 and 7 are very strong with all year levels achieving above the National Average and also out performing students from 'like schools'.

#### Year 3 NAPLaN Trend 2011-14


Year 3 NAPLaN results have continued to remain strong in the areas of Reading, Writing and Grammar where mean scores are at or above National results.

Whilst there has been a slight improvement in numeracy results at year 3, Numeracy will remain a whole-school priority for improvement.




#### Year 5 NAPLaN Trend 2011-14

The Year 5 NAPLaN results indicate improvement in the majority of test aspects, with the exception being Reading. Our 2014 Year 5 Writing result is particularly pleasing with our student's mean score above the National mean score.



#### Year 7 NAPLaN Trend 2011-14

Mean score results at year 7 are very strong and have shown further improvement in all test aspects in 2014.




## **Improvement Priorities cont.**Literacy and Numeracy - NAPLAN


All Year 7 students are above National Minimal Standard in Numeracy, Reading, Writing, and Spelling.

NAPLaN Mean Scores are placed within a six band range with the aim being to have a significant proportion of students within the top two Proficiency Bands.

#### Year 3 Top 2 Proficiency Bands 2012-14

The percentages of students in the top 2 Proficiency Bands at year 3 have remained relatively high with particularly strong results in Reading and an improvement in Numeracy.





#### Year 5 Top 2 Proficiency Bands 2012-14

Moving forward our challenge remains to increase the percentage of students whose results are placed within the top two Proficiency Bands.

This year's year 5 data indicates a decline in the percentage of students in the top two Proficiency Bands across all test aspects when comparing this cohort's result of 2012.

#### Year 7 Top 2 Proficiency Bands 2012-14

Year 7 results are very pleasing with WBPS students achieving above the National average in all five test aspects. Particularly pleasing is the fact that 44% of year 7 students are placed within the top 2 Proficiency Bands for Writing in 2014 when 0% of the same cohort was placed in the top two Proficiency Bands as year fives in 2012. This is an outstanding result!

#### PRIORITY THREE: Engagement & Wellbeing


