GOVERNANCE

Independent schools are generally notfor-profit institutions founded by groups in the community. All Independent schools are registered with the relevant state or territory education authorities.

Independent schools are primarily accountable to their parent and school communities.

About 17 per cent of Independent schools operate within an approved system authority. These include the Anglican, Lutheran or Seventh Day Adventist Systems.

All Independent schools comply with relevant state and federal education legislation and regulation.

SOURCES OF INCOME

Most of the income of Independent schools comes from families. Most of the recurrent income of Independent schools comes from families. Governments save an estimated \$7.1 billion due to the contribution of families and other private sources.



GOVERNMENT FUNDING OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS

Government funding for schools is provided by the Australian Government and state and territory governments. The Australian Government is the main government funding source for non-government schools, currently providing 78 per cent of total government recurrent funding for Independent schools while states and territories provide 22 per cent. State and territory governments are the main funding source for government schools. The proportions of private/government funding vary greatly from school to school.
