SCHOLARSHIPS MAKE STUDYING EASIER



Scholarships are "a grant or payment made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement."

The money is donated by businesses, universities, organisations or individuals who see the value of further education. Federal and state governments may also provide scholarships to help make further education more equitable for everyone, or to encourage studies in areas or skills that are in demand.

YOU WON'T HAVE TO PAY IT BACK

Scholarships are debt free, so unlike a loan, you will not have to pay back any money. You might receive the award as a one-off payment, or as smaller amounts, e.g. annually or each semester.

If you're awarded a scholarship, it could pay for part or all of your course or study fees.

Sometimes the scholarship provider can be specific and dictate what you need to spend the money on.

It could cover fees, textbooks, accommodation, study supplies, travel or living expenses, but in some cases the money comes with no strings attached.

What about the pandemic?

We know that there has been lots of disruption to studies this year because of COVID-19. But Universities and other institutions are working to assist you in any way they can.

Even if you don't meet all the requirements for a scholarship, or if it's close to the closing date, we encourage you to apply anyway – there will be lots of students in the same boat as you, and the provider may be willing to take your situation into consideration.

Scholarship applications are open as normal this year, and there is more opportunity now than ever for you to apply for a hardship or equity scholarship. Even some academic scholarships have had their requirements lowered, so don't think you won't be able to apply.

Nobody is sure how long these disruptions will last, so if you find yourself being awarded a scholarship but need to defer your studies, make sure you talk to the university or institution. Many of them will let you defer your scholarship for a year and accept it when you start studying later – but also keep in mind that some scholarships have strict no-deferral conditions.

WHY THEY GIVE OUT SCHOLARSHIPS

It can help to understand the reasons why organisations offer scholarships – and it's not just to attract the 'best and brightest'. Scholarships are given out for three key reasons:

- To make study possible for students who couldn't otherwise afford it
- **2.** To encourage enrolment in specific courses or fields
- To attract students with certain attributes, such as intelligence, sporting ability, or community service

Scholarships generally fit into two categories - one based on your personal achievements, and one that helps people who may have been disadvantaged:

Equity Scholarships

- Financial Hardship
- Disturbance/upheaval at school
- Remote & Regional Students
- Female Students
- Indigenous
- Refugee Status

Merit Scholarships

- Academic Achievement
- Sporting or Performing Ability
- All-round Achievement
- Community Service

There are also scholarships for special interest groups, such as for the children of veterans, agricultural industry scholarships, or for scholars studying specific subjects.



THE FINE PRINT

Each scholarship is unique and has eligibility criteria associated with it; usually you will have to meet the criteria, otherwise your application won't be considered. However, there may be some exceptions this year due to exceptional circumstances.

There may be terms and conditions that you'll have to agree to, such as agreeing to mentor others, maintaining a certain grade, getting involved with specific activities, or simply writing a thank you letter to the benefactor.

There's no limit to the number of scholarships that you can apply for, but some scholarships might state that you'll only be awarded the money if you haven't been granted any other awards.

If you meet the criteria, apply

A scholarship could help you achieve your goals, make your life less stressful, and allow you to enter the workforce with less debt.

While some scholarships are well known and highly competitive, others often fail to attract applicants – which means anyone who applies (and meets the eligibility criteria) could find themselves successful.

Plus, applying for scholarships is good practice for applying for jobs later on, and scholarships look amazing on your resume; so apply even if you don't think you'll get it. You never know what could happen.



FINDING SCHOLARSHIPS

Once you've chosen a provider and course, check their website for scholarships available and see if you're eligible to apply.

If you can't easily find their scholarships, you could call their future student centre and ask them what's available – you never know, if you've got a good case for assistance, they may offer you a scholarship even if they don't normally have them.

The Study Work Grow Scholarships page is a great place to start your search, with over 1,000 listed and more going on each week.

FIND SCHOLARSHIPS

What next?

Once you've found a scholarship you'd like to apply for:

- 1. Read the eligibility criteria
- 2. Read all the terms and conditions
- 3. Familiarise yourself with the application process, note down deadlines, interview days and other key dates
- 4. Complete your application
- 5. Triple check your application and make sure you've attached any necessary supporting documents
- 6. Make sure your application is submitted on time
