The Australian Federal Police (AFP) is Australia's national policing agency. In a constantly evolving criminal environment, a multi-disciplinary approach is vital to protect Australia's interests and way of life. The AFP is made up of adaptive and agile teams with a range of skills to stay a step ahead.

In addition to police officers and protective service officers, the AFP employs specialist and support staff in key areas, including Cybercrime, Intelligence, Forensics and Fraud and Anti-corruption.

### Cybercrime

Cybercrime is a key focus for the AFP and the Australian Government. Cybercrime functions in a cooperative arrangement with Australian and international law enforcement agencies, the financial sector and private and government organisations.

The Cybercrime Investigations team model is multi-disciplinary with investigators, intelligence officers and technical specialists working together to combat the threat of cybercrime and:

- investigate cybercrime against the Australian Government, critical infrastructure and systems of national significance, or those that impact on the whole of the Australian economy
- disrupt the efforts of cyber criminals using the dark web and anonymising technologies to evade detection
- connect domestic and international law enforcement agencies to counter cybercrime
- work with Australian Government agencies and law enforcement on joint prevention awareness and education media campaigns.

# Intelligence

Working as an intelligence officer or criminal intelligence analyst, you will use your critical thinking and analytical ability to provide timely, relevant and high-quality actionable intelligence to mitigate threats to Australia. This role enables you to influence all levels of decision making in the AFP and make a real impact. The role of AFP Intelligence is to:

- play a crucial role in providing AFP investigators with intelligence to assist with domestic and international investigations, and to identify leads for future investigations
- develop and maintain working relationships with domestic and foreign law enforcement agencies to provide intelligence reporting
- liaise and collaborate with external agencies to support whole-of-government priorities, discover and develop technical and analytical tools, and deliver high-level predictive intelligence products.

### **Forensics**

AFP Forensics comprises a large number of specialist services and capabilities at the AFP's state-of-the-art Forensics facility in Canberra and within the AFP's regional commands across Australia.

AFP Forensics is recognised as one of the world leaders in policing science and technology and its role is to:

- support the frontline and maximise the AFP's operational impact by delivering a broad range of forensic capability and technical knowledge
- maintain and evolve the AFP's forensics specialisations to meet emerging threats and deliver results
- work alongside domestic and international partners, through collaboration of ideas and diversity of thought.

## **Fraud and Anti-corruption**

As an investigator or intelligence officer in Fraud and Anti-corruption within the Crime Command, you will provide expert technical support, advice and capability development for investigations and intelligence processes. Fraud and Anti-corruption's role is to investigate reports of fraud and/or corruption, including wrongful use of Australian Government information or intellectual property, cartel conduct or collusion, misuse of Australian Government assets, equipment or facilities and accounting fraud.
