Early Life

Jettson “ Jett “ Lawrence was born on August 7, 2003 in Landsborough, Queensland. He grew up with his dad Darren, mother Emma, bothers Tate and Hunter. Hunter and Jett watched supercross from the US on TV. That inspired Jett from the age of seven years old. Jett idolised fellow Australian Chad Reed. Jett dreamt of following in Chads foot steps.



Where It All Began.



Jett and Hunter excelled in junior motocross Championships. In 2014, Jett and his family flew to Belgium where Jett and Hunter competed in the 65cc World Championship. Jett was crowned the 2014 65 cc World Championship in his class. Jett's family felt that if Jett and Hunter kept competing in the World Junior Motocross Championships Jett and Hunter would eventually get noticed. Opportunities would quickly come for Jett and Hunter to race in Europe and the US.

In 2016 at the age of 14, Jett raced in the Allgeminer Deutscher Automobile-Club series and the 85 European Motocross Championship. The Lawrence family then relocated to the US.



Jett's Career

In 2020 Jett had finished his first full American Motorcyclist Association supercross and Motocross season. In Jett's third Supercross in his first race he broke his collarbone, which put him out of racing for 6 weeks. When Jett came back to race, he made his maiden supercross podium at Salt Lake City in Utah. At only sixteen years old. Jett finished 10th overall at the end of the season. Jett had a solid debut season in the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA). He finished in the top five four times and won his first overall in round 9 at Fox Raceway. This put Jett at 4th in the final standings and Jett won the 2020 Marty Smith Rookie of the year award.



Conclusion



Currently, Jett Lawrence is out with a thumb injury from when he was racing in the American Motorcyclists Association, Pro Motocross. On the 5 Jan 24 Jett raced in the supercross at Anaheim America. At Jett's first race at Anaheim he came first. After heaps and heaps more races around America Jett won the 450SX Supercross Championship. When Jett retires he will leave a massive legacy.
