HOMEWORK



Homework is assigned every Friday and is due the following Friday, two weeks later. The homework consists of the following tasks:

- 1.Reading Log: Students should read for at least 10 nights during the twoweek period. They must record this in their diaries and have a parent sign it off.
- 2. Maths Sheets: Students are required to complete two maths sheets. We encourage them to highlight any problems they would like clarification on from their teacher during correction time.

Additionally, if time allows, students are encouraged to log into their Typing Club account to practice touch typing, as well as their Times Table Rockstars account to enhance their fluency.



LITERACY/TOPIC

YOU BELONG

This term, our literacy lessons will be integrated with a knowledge-rich curriculum focused on STEM, with a special emphasis on technology, coding, and programming. Students will develop key literacy skills as they read, write, and discuss these exciting topics, deepening their understanding of how technology shapes our world. Through hands-on activities and creative projects, they'll also learn the fundamentals of coding and programming, preparing them for the future while building their critical thinking and problemsolving skills.

Students will dedicate time every day to morphology, fluency and comprehension as well as time each week to enhancing vocabulary, handwriting and typing.

Beginning week 5, we will be reading Dirrarn, the sequel to Black Cockatoo. During this novel study, students will describe how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander authors use symbols and imagery to share cultural perspectives and stories in texts.

SPELLING MASTERY

Our students will continue with their Spelling Mastery groups, deepening their understanding of literacy fundamentals. Through highly structured targeted lessons, they will focus on enriching their vocabulary using phonemic, morphemic, and whole-word approaches.
