SCHOLARSHIPS

Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships

Value: Student fee waiver

Open/Closing Dates: July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020

The NSW Government's Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships mean that students can get training to get the skills they need to get the job they want and their course fees will be covered.

To be eligible for a Fee-Free Scholarship, you must:

- be wanting to study a Smart and Skilled subsidised Certificate I, Certificate II,
 Certificate III or Certificate IV level qualification on the NSW Skills List, including those
 qualifications that support apprenticeships and traineeships (use the <u>Course Finder</u>);
 and
- meet the Smart and Skilled <u>eligibility criteria</u>.

AND

- be aged between 15 and 30 years when you start training; and
- be either the recipient of a specific Australian Government welfare benefit or allowance or the dependant of such a recipient; or
- be aged 15-17 years and currently in out-of-home care or aged 18-30 years and previously have been in out-of-home care

OR

 be aged 15 years or over and have a letter of recommendation from a domestic and family violence service, refuge or other support agency

At the end of the day it won't matter if you or your team won, the qualities necessary for entering and competing will still reflect well on you.

School work, assignments and exams might not be doing you justice. We're not all the same after all, so choosing to enter competitions will give you another opportunity to show off your skills and aptitudes.

Applying for Summer Jobs

When you're applying for a job always give it your best shot.

There's no difference between applying for a casual summer job, part time work, or some high-powered graduate career – employers will want to know you're taking their business seriously and you'll be giving the job your all.

Applications

Make sure your application:

- Addresses all the criteria in the advert adapt your cover letter and resume to suit
- Contains up to date and accurate information
- Looks fantastic, if it's hand-written then make sure you take enough time to make it neat and legible

- Has been proof-read check the spelling and grammar, make sure it reads well and makes sense
- Gets in on time or, if there's no deadline, then get it in as soon as possible to give yourself the best chance

Once you've submitted an application, remember to check your emails, voicemails or answer all your calls. Don't delay finding out if you've been selected for an interview or even got the job.

Interviews

You can land a job without an interview, but it's more common that your application will get your shortlisted. Then you'll have to attend an interview to determine if you'll be offered the job.

Be prepared for your interview by practising <u>mock interviews</u> and finding the <u>perfect</u> outfit to give you confidence and make the right impression.

Do a little bit of research about the company and the job you've applied for, it'll show in the interview.

It's perfectly normal to be nervous but to stay as calm as possible so that you can do yourself justice.

Thank the interviewer for their time before you leave.

Follow up

Once you've submitted an application or you've had an interview, if you don't hear back within a week or so – give them a call or email just to follow up. It could show that you're enthusiastic and serious about the job.

<u>Parliament House, Sydney, NSW</u> – tours are conducted twice a week and they're open for a few special public events throughout the year too.

<u>Global Nomadic</u> are an organisation with offices in the UK, USA and here in Australia, they've been in the business for 10 years and have helped over 10,000 people learn new skills whilst making a valuable contribution to communities.

You won't get paid, in fact you'll have to pay for the experience since most of the organisations you'll work with can't afford to host you. You'll pay for travel and expenses while you're there, in return you'll get mentoring and hands-on experience.

Have a read about the <u>projects</u> they have available, read up on their <u>FAQs</u>, and find out if this could be an option for you one summer break, or as a gap year option.

Eligibility criteria does apply, for most projects you'll have to be 18 or older for example – so make sure you read the small print before you sign up for anything.

Encouraging students to take part in competitions could have lots of benefits. Taking part in something that isn't schoolwork might seem more appealing, and they get the autonomy to choose which competitions they'd like to enter. In politics experience is priceless

If you're interested in a career in politics – there's a huge number of careers to consider and lots of pathways that'll get you there.

There are plenty of tertiary qualifications in politics, but if you're not keen on studying, or you'd like to make yourself a more competitive graduate, there's another option to consider.

Relevant experience is key. With a passion for politics a lack of formal qualifications doesn't have to be an obstacle. Make sure you stay up to date and informed about current affairs and politics, then get involved and be active on the political scene.

You can volunteer and get work experience that will count for a lot in your pursuit of a career.

You could:

- Get involved in political issues with your school or uni –research the governance, read up on the school boards projects and ask for opportunities to volunteer with them, speak to your PTA and ask them to consider you for any opportunities that come up.
- Join a debating team
- Work on the student newspaper and focus on political reports
- Find work experience with local MPs, the mayoral office or your local council
- Search for politically active groups in your community that you can get involved with (there are plenty and they address lots of different issues from social justice to education)
- Get involved in the voting process, even if you can't vote yourself yet recruiting voters or signing them in at the polls on election days
- If you feel really strongly about some issues, then research formal and informal activism and see how you can muster support for your cause and lobby local politicians and organisations to make a positive change
- Sign up with youth politics groups such as <u>UN Youth Australia</u> and <u>Youth Action</u> and actively participate with them
- Attend events that are relevant where you'll get to learn and absorb more about the field.

Work on the skills you'll need if for a position in public office, such as:

- Public speaking
- Communications verbal and written
- Presentation skills
- Active listening
- Leadership
- Discussing emotive political issues in a calm and rational manner
- Technical skills including IT

A career in Politics

Politics is both an art and science that focuses on people. Politicians and politics are at play in nearly every career and life scenario to some extent. Our daily lives are dictated by rules and laws designed to benefit individuals and develop and maintain flourishing communities and countries.

What type of person would this job suit?

- You need to be **passionate** and **enthusiastic** about people and politics
- Great at **networking** and building strong **relationships** with others
- Be approachable and a good listener
- Have a thorough understanding of local and national issues, and be up to date with current affairs
- Possess excellent analytical thinking and communication (verbal and written) skills
- Remain calm, confident and professional in all situations especially when you're engaged in public speaking and presentations
- Adept at crisis management and problem solving

Industries where politics is important:

- Government
- Law and Justice
- Business
- Defence and Intelligence
- Education
- Journalism and Media

Pathways

There are lots of ways that you can have a meaningful job within politics. You don't have to be aiming to become Prime Minister – although ambition and the drive to succeed could be advantageous in this competitive industry.

You can get in to politics through **a lot** of different pathways; formal or tertiary qualifications are not necessarily required. Showing your commitment and gaining valuable experience through volunteering, campaigning and involvement with a political party is one of the best pathways there is.

You could get other useful experience from:

- being involved in student politics
- get involved in a debating team or student newspaper
- find work experience with local MPs, the mayoral office or local council

Choosing to study a degree in politics could make you a more competitive candidate for some professional roles.

A full-time, 5 year, <u>Bachelor of Social Science with the degree of Bachelor of Laws with a Major in Political Economy and Social Policy at Macquarie</u> could give you all the qualifications you'd need to apply for a huge range of careers in the political arena. Alternatively, you can start out at TAFE and gain a Cert III or IV, or find a traineeship, before getting some experience and deciding if you want, or need, to go to uni later on. A <u>Certificate III in Business with Social Media from Training Connections Australia</u> is an example of a course that could open doors into a political career too.

Levels

Social Media Advisor

None

You'd be developing, implementing and maintaining social media communications. Demonstrating political acumen by providing relevant communications advice and recommendations.

You could get some short courses under your belt and volunteer your time to work with local politicians and organisations as a social media advisor. Gaining valuable work experience, networking and obtaining a proven track record could offer up opportunities for next level positions.

As a volunteer you might not get paid initially, but if the position is made official and you're offered a job, a salaried position could be on offer.

Political Staffer

Relevant experience or university degree

A political staffer or aide works in a political office supporting a candidate or elected official by advising, researching, scheduling, fundraising, or writing for them, among other responsibilities.

There's no formal qualification or training to be a staffer, you'll learn on the job. Generally some previous political experience is desirable. Although it's not unusual for junior members to be recruited straight from university.

As a junior you could expect to earn over \$40,000 per year, going up to \$77,000 per year (or more) with experience.

Political Journalist

Diploma

You'd be reporting on controversies, campaigns and debates, providing analysis of political events, as well as presenting on potential outcomes, incentives and trends. You could work in one or more outlets including print, online, TV, or radio.

Relevant experience is crucial (it could be at the office of a local or national newspaper), and building up professional network of contacts even more so. A <u>Professional Communication Certificate</u>, <u>Certificate III in Screen and Media</u>, a diploma, bachelor degree or postgraduate degree in journalism could all kick off your career. Lots of news outlets also offer 12 month cadetships for graduates.

You could expect to earn \$80,000 per year as a qualified and experienced journalist. Jobs:

Member of Parliament (MP)

Bachelor's Degree

An MP is expected to work for the benefit of Australia, their local constituents, and for their party. You could be developing policies, legislations and by-laws, be a spokesperson, investigator and more.

With the right skills, work experience and contacts, you could become a Member of Parliament without formal qualifications, though they often have university qualifications, which could help you become an MP more quickly.

Federal Senators and members base salary is \$207,000 per year. State Government salaries vary but you could expect to earn a base salary of \$150,000 per year (*2018 figures).

To become an MP, you'll have to be elected by your party or the public.

Growth in this industry is **moderate** and expected to remain so.
