












WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN EXCHANGE STUDENT?

STUDY ABROAD AND STUDENT EXCHANGE

Throughout this brochure, you may notice the terms "Study Abroad" and "Student Exchange." While they sound similar, the programs are actually a little different. On a Student Exchange program, host families are volunteers and do not receive any payment/reimbursement for hosting. On a **Study Abroad** program, host families receive a payment and schools may charge tuition. Our processes remain the same for both programs, so regardless of which program you choose, we will provide the highest quality overseas experience!

APPLICATION / ACCEPTANCE **PROCESS**

- Complete the online pre-application form and pay the \$100 application fee.
- You will be invited to complete an eligibility interview, either online or at our office, to help us assess your motivations and make sure you are making the right
- If you are eligible, you will receive instructions on how to proceed with the full application. In the event of ineligibility, we will refund the \$100 application fee.
- Program acceptance will be confirmed to you in writing upon assessment of your complete application by WEP Australia and the overseas partner organisation.

Note: documents to be completed by your school and doctor will be required, as well as vaccinations (depending on destination). Don't worry, we'll explain everything to you!

The WEP advantage: Our procedures

Thanks to procedures developed by WEP and the experience accumulated over the years by our team of experts, we can effectively assess our students' motivations to ensure that each of them makes the right program choice.

FINDING YOUR HOST FAMILY AND SCHOOL

- Your application is sent to our partner organisation in the country of your choice, so they can begin the search and selection of a host family and school.
- Placement with a host family and school is a complex process. It can take some time to secure your host family and school enrolment overseas.
- Placement information can arrive at any time, sometimes close to your scheduled departure date.
- You will receive your placement information from WEP by phone. We will then send you the details by email for you to start communicating with your host family.

The WEP advantage: **Host family selection**

Each potential host family is visited by a local coordinator. The coordinator determines whether the home offers the right environment for a successful exchange experience. Host families submit their own application, and criminal history checks are completed in all countries for anyone aged 18 or over living in the home.

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PREPARING FOR YOUR DEPARTURE

- You attend a comprehensive orientation (see below). Part of the orientation is dedicated to parents, who need to be prepared as well. This will be an opportunity to get answers to all final questions that you may have.
- We'll help you with all the travel arrangements before you leave. We'll take care of your flight booking, the insurance that covers you during your stay, and supervise your visa processing.
- You receive your student pack with your backpack, luggage tags and most importantly, your WEP hoodie!

Our pre-departure orientation covers everything you will need to know about your program! We cover all the essential information for a successful stay overseas, leaving nothing to chance. Visas, luggage, pocket money, insurance, integration, social life, cultural differences and communication are just some topics that we discuss.

It's a chance for them to really come to terms with the adventure that they are about to embark on, through an immersive and interactive course that alternates between training and socialising with other WEP students, returned students who have all lived the experience of the school program overseas, and WEP staff.

The orientation, entirely designed by WEP, covers all the key topics: your expectations of the program, your host family, the challenges you will face, the school system in your host country, cultural differences... You will also be able to exchange ideas and share your experiences with other young people who are about to embark on the same experience as you, and realise that you are not alone! Parents also attend a session with content designed specifically for them. Attendance is compulsory for students and parents.

Once your orientation is complete, you will be ready to leave with a clear head, and all the cards in your hand to make your overseas program a success!

When you think of France, do you think of the Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame, Arc de Triomphe or the Louvre Museum? France is not only full of iconic attractions, but a lively culture with language, family and food as a priority.

The French language is highly respected, and a language that is spoken around the world. The French language is often linked to the French cultural identity, making the country's residents proud of their language. French is the second most learnt foreign language in the world. A cultural immersion is the best way to become an expert.

Some of the tastiest foods come from France, including croissants, macarons and baguettes. France is also known for less common foods, including snails and frog legs! Trying new foods with your host family is one of the best ways to get to know the local culture.



Life in France

Family is important to French people. Weekends are often spent visiting family members. In some areas, families may reside with grandparents and other members of the family. Many people will continue to reside in the towns or cities that they grew up in to remain connected to their family.

Food and eating culture is important to the French. There are typically three meals a day, breakfast, lunch and dinner. Dinner is the largest meal of the day and often eaten with family. Meals may include an entrée, the main and dessert. Sometimes, cheese is served after the main course. Before a meal, it is common and polite to say "bon appétit", meaning "enjoy your meal".

Greetings in France are quite different to Australia. Most French people will greet friends and family members with "la bise", a kiss on both cheeks. If you are unsure how to greet someone, you can always follow the lead of your friends and host family.



School in France starts in September and ends in July the following year. School takes up most of the day and may be tiring at first, but the experience will allow you to master the language and make friends in no time! Classes usually last 55 minutes each and take place Monday through to Friday, from about 8:30am to 5:30pm.

The main subjects are French, history, English, geography, maths, physics, chemistry, science, biology, and physical education. During the lunch break, you will eat at the school cafeteria. This is a chance to try the local cuisine and bond with classmates you've met in class.

School generally does not have a wide choice of extracurricular activities, but it is still easy for students to participate in sports and activities outside of school hours. Whether you wish to continue a sport or activity that you do in Australia or try something new, your new friends and host family will be able to assist you in joining a local club.

Optional extra!

Life in Belgium

An exchange in Belgium will see you enjoying the good things in life with your friends and host family. Belgians have a unique sense of humour and an affinity for self-mockery. They will expect some sort of good humour in return. Above all, Belgians are modest and tolerant and gladly share their culture and stories with others.

Belgians value quality time with friends and family. Generally, families will continue residing in the same city or town they grew up in to remain close to family. Weekends are often spent with family, visiting grandparents, aunts and uncles.

Soccer is an important sport in Belgium. The national team, the Red Devils, are admired by Belgians, with supporters wearing team colours on game day. The country hosts the Belgian Pro League, a soccer league with 16 clubs from different areas in Belgium.

Belgium is very proud of perfecting the recipes for the best waffles and fries. A walk in Brussels is not complete without trying Belgian waffles with chocolate sauce and powdered sugar, fries with mayonnaise served in paper cones, and their famous chocolates!

Whether you are passionate about sports, love trying new foods or simply want to engage in an energetic culture, an exchange program to Belgium will have you amazed!

School life

The Belgian school year starts in early September and ends at the end of June. Students get the summer off to relax and get ready for the following school year.

Secondary education in split into three stages, each lasting two years. The first two years of secondary education include the same compulsory subjects: French, history and geography, a foreign language, science and physical education.

In the following secondary school years, students have more choice, and can choose a study stream based on their career goals and interests. Subject selection is broader, with options including economics, social sciences, physical education or another language.

Schools in Belgium are either French, Dutch or German, depending on the region and the language spoken. Each region governs their own school system, with small differences between the regions. For this program in particular, your school will be French speaking.

It is common for Belgian high schools to not offer extracurricular activities. However, you can look into different activities with the help of your new community.



Belgium is such an incredible country to live as an exchange student. The people are so friendly, the food is amazing, and the landscapes are beautiful. It felt like a really safe place to live and I felt so welcomed by my school and host community from the first day I arrived. Discover the warmth and friendliness of the Italian people as you live and study in Italy. As a local in Italy, you will encounter a culture that is based on family, tradition and food. Practise your Italian with your host family over authentic Italian pasta which can be eaten with all kinds of sauces, or pizza with simple, but delicious toppings!

Italy has been inhabited for hundreds of thousands of years. Many aspects of the Italian culture today stem from Roman influence, including food and architecture. Some of the most notable Italian attractions, including the Colosseum, the Pantheon and the Roman Forum, were built by the Romans.

Located in Southern Europe, Italy has a geography that varies from snow capped mountains in the north, to stunning coastal towns in the south. The country's history is rich! Be surrounded by centuries old architecture from the Roman Empire and the Renaissance as you get to know this fascinating country from the inside.

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Life in Italy

Family is one of the most important aspects in Italian culture. Family structure differs in the north of Italy compared to the south. Typically, families in the north form a nuclear structure (parents and children), whereas in southern Italy, it is not uncommon for extended family members to live together.

Italians are known to be friendly and helpful when foreigners speak their language. They are easy to talk to and will not hesitate to exchange a few words with you.

From the tantalising smells of markets and restaurants to the sweet perfumes of lavender fields and olive groves, Italians truly live "La Dolce Vita", or "the sweet life"!

School life

High school in Italy typically goes from September to June. As an Italian student, you will attend high school like your peers, with the school day usually starting at 8am and finishing at 2pm. Students spend the afternoons completing homework, playing sport or engaging in other extracurricular activities. Due to the reduced hours, many schools have classes on a Saturday.

Learning will be content focussed, with teachers given a great deal of respect. It is common for students to remain in the one classroom all day, with the teachers moving between the rooms.

Subjects in Italy can vary school to school. Generally, Italian students study maths, sciences, languages, music and physical education.

WEP+

A WEP+ program offers an additional level of choice. On this program, you can choose to be placed in one of four Italian regions: Northern Italy, Central Italy, Southern Italy or the Italian Islands.

Live your American dream on an exchange to the USA. From school spirit, prom, yellow buses and Halloween, the USA has something for everyone!

The USA is a powerhouse country when it comes to TV, movies and music. The country has produced some of the biggest movies to hit the big screen. On an exchange to the USA, you will get to know the locals and the culture on a different level to how the movies portray the country.

The geography of the USA varies from state to state. States in the Southwest region have desert landscapes. States in this area include Arizona, the home of the Grand Canyon. Further to the east is the mid-Atlantic region, which includes populated cities such as New York and Washington D.C. Washington state is good for nature lovers, with half of the state covered in forest.

The food in the USA is always a hot topic. On exchange, you could try some of the most iconic American foods, such as the American apple pie, deep dish pizza or a Texas barbeque.

Not matter what you are into, the USA will certainly satisfy your craving!



Life in the USA

The immensity and diversity of the landscapes across the country's 50 states are breathtaking! Huge metropolitan cities like New York or Los Angeles, the Great Plains in the centre, dream beaches in California or Florida, the Rocky Mountains, the Grand Canyon, deserts and lakes all form the USA's unique environment.

Like its landscapes, the American culture is as varied. The United States has the greatest ethnic diversity in the world! Despite their differences, all Americans are deeply patriotic and attached to their nation and the values that make it strong. They all rally around the national anthem and the flag, two strong symbols of American patriotism that are present at school as well as during major events.

Despite English being the official language spoken in the USA, the country has many different accents and slang. With an estimated 30 different dialects, English in the USA may not be what you are used to. Americans are often intrigued by the Australian accent! Use this to your advantage to start conversations and make friends!

School life

Depending on the state in which you are placed, the school year begins between the end of July and mid-September and ends between mid-May and the end of June of the following year. The year is divided into two semesters: from the beginning of the school year to the end of December or mid-January, and from the end of December or mid-January to May/June. A typical school day may start around 7:30/8:00am and end around 2:00/2:30pm, with a 20-30 minute break for Junch.

Apart from a few compulsory subjects such as English or American history, each student chooses their courses according to their desires. And the choice is enormous: from drama to design, from photography to cooking, from journalism to computer science or psychology. Choice is just as important when it comes to afternoon sports, cultural and social activities. Choose from soccer, baseball, athletics, basketball, volleyball, marching band, cheerleading, debate club, speech club, or year book staff... Joining a club is one of the best ways to get involved and make friends!

At school you'll finally have the chance to experience for yourself all those typically American things you've seen in movies and TV series: the lockers where you keep your items, the cheerleaders, homecoming, prom night, cafeterias, your high school football and basketball games and "school spirit" - the sense of community that unites students from the same school.



HOST FAMILIES IN THE USA

Hosting an exchange student has become a way of life in the USA, and families are proud of their relationship with the exchange students. Of course, they expect you to be just as involved! As a member of your host family, you will share in household activities such as outings, activities, family visits, shopping (but also household chores!) and, throughout your stay, you'll have the opportunity to discover all the little cultural differences that make the experience so rich.

On an exchange program to the USA, you can be placed anywhere within the country. This is an exciting opportunity to really get to know the American culture outside of stereotypes from TV and movies. No two exchanges in the US are ever the same!

An exchange program to Denmark will have you immersed into the culture of one of the happiest countries in the world. See for yourself what makes this Scandinavian country so joyful!

In Denmark, generally two parents work full time outside of the home. Families typically get together at the end of the day to share a meal and talk about their day. Traditional Danish food is often on the menu, including herring, or smørrebrød, a type of open sandwich usually topped with cold meats, cheese and garnishes.

The weather in Denmark varies intensely from summer to winter. Typical summer weather consists of long days and temperatures in the mid to high 20s. Winter in Denmark is cold and dark, with snow coating most of the towns and cities. However, the Danish spirit does not dampen, with plenty of Christmas markets, winter activities and the feeling of "hygge", which roughly translates to "cosiness".

Cycling is a popular method of transport in Denmark. The country is relatively flat, making cycling an easy and inexpensive way to get around. Cities are built for cyclists, with many Danes cycling to school and work. The country even has a cycling embassy who's goal it is to further promote cycling both in and out side of Denmark.

School life

Students aged between 6 and 16 years attend a type of school called Folkeskolen. Upper secondary education (for those aged between 16 to 19) is known as Gymnasium and consists of 2 streams: a general stream that gives access to higher education, and a technical stream which prepares students for particular industries or trades. Classes typically begin at 8-9am and finish around 2-3pm

Danish schools are usually pretty casual. Wearing a uniform is not required and some students call their teachers by their first names. Nevertheless, respect and discipline are obligatory. Active participation in class and lots of group work are two signature aspects of the Danish education system.

Sport classes, such as Physical Education, is not as common as other countries. However, many students take advantage of their free time by joining a sports club.

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

School life

Secondary education is compulsory until age 16. Students then enrol into two years of high school. High school offers a general option and a vocational option. Subjects at schools can vary, but can include languages, sciences, maths, history and business studies.

Generally, the school year begins at the end of September and ends in June. Classes are Monday through Friday, from about 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., with an average of 30 classes per week. Some schools finish early enough for students to eat lunch at home, whereas others have a break during the day for students to eat at school.

School in Spain usually does not offer extracurricular activities. With the help of your host family, you can arrange after school activities to be able to attend different sports, classes and other clubs.

Get to know the diverse and fascinating German culture and language as you immerse yourself into the local way of life.

At first glance, Germans may seem cold and distant, but generally they are warm and friendly. The country has been unified for just over 30 years after the fall of the Berlin wall. Young Germans are building their society a fresh, new image, thanks to their free spirit and first-class visual art, music and fashion scenes

The official language in Germany is "Deutsch" (German). The language has many different dialects and accents, varying across different regions. People in northern Germany speak slightly different to southern Germany. Despite the differences, Germans can usually understand each other, regardless of which dialect they speak.

German is home to some unique and tasty foods! Try German sausage, authentic pretzels or Schweineschnitzel (pork schnitzel)!





STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

School life

Your day in German high school can start between 7:30am and 8:00am, and end between 1pm and 1:30pm. From 9 Klasse to 11 Klasse, students combine compulsory subjects (German, science, maths, geography, history, social sciences, art, sport and 2 foreign languages) with 2 major subjects, selected by the student, to be studied in more detail (3rd foreign language, philosophy, psychology, religion, computer science, music, sport...).

The afternoon is free for you to practise a sport or activity, or simply spend time with your new friends. You can also stay at school and take part in Arbeitsgemeinschaften (AG), lessons offered after school hours and supervised by teachers.

The final year of study ends with the Abitur examination. Exchange students are never placed in the final year at German schools, which is reserved for local students preparing for their final exams.

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

School life

The Finnish school year runs from August to May, with school hours typically being between 8am-2pm. Students usually learn Swedish as their first foreign language and core subjects include maths, geography, history and science. Despite the fewer school hours, Finnish students are rarely given homework to complete. Instead, they use free time to be involved with extra activities and to spend time with friends or family.

A free lunch is provided to all students in Finland, taking place over a 45 minute lunch break. Students are not required to wear uniforms.

Senior students who are finishing their studies complete the matriculation examination. The exams take place twice a year, once in Autumn and once in Spring. The exams scores are used for admittance into higher education.

School life

Most Thai schools have two semesters. The first semester runs from May to early October, and the second from November to late February. In some schools, students must be at school by 8am to sing the national anthem and watch the raising of the Thai flag. Like Australia, students in Thai schools wear a school uniform.

Schools in Thailand follow eight core subjects: Thai language, health and physical education, religion and culture, maths, science, social studies, arts, careers and technology, and foreign languages.

There is an emphasis on social life in the Thai culture as well as in school. After school activities that students can join to be with friends are very popular. Some schools require their students to join an extracurricular activity. Activities include a variety of sport, art and music.

Argentina is the second largest country in South America and is a country of contrast and wide-open spaces. Argentina is divided into four main regions: the Pampas, the Andes, Patagonia and the Northeast. From the Andes mountain range to the Perito Moreno Glacier, the incredible Iguazú Falls to the immense plains of the Pampas, Argentina's landscapes are varied and magnificent.

School life

High school students in Argentina choose their studies based on their career goals and interests. Students choose from Bachiller schools (humanities), Commercial schools (business and economics) and Escuelas Tecnicas (technical and applied sciences). The curriculum can vary from one school to another, but three subjects are compulsory: history, geography, and languages (English, French, Portuguese, or Italian).

The school year begins at the beginning of March and ends at the end of November. Similar to Australia, students have three months of holidays from December to February.

Classes start at 8:00am and end around 2:00pm. The afternoon is devoted to extracurricular activities. You will have the choice between a lot of sporting activities (soccer, rugby, basketball) or cultural activities (music, dance, theatre). Getting involved in these clubs is one of the best ways to integrate and make friends!



Life in the UK

A program to the UK will see you placed in either England, Scotland or Wales. Regardless of where you are placed, the culture remains fairly similar. They share the same currency, language and Royal Family, but have varying accents and English dialects.

The people of the United Kingdom are very passionate about sport. Many popular sports were invented in the United Kingdom, including modern day soccer and tennis, rugby and cricket. Many people follow the English Football League, with teams from England and Wales. Cricket is also very popular, with a strong competition between the English and Australian cricket teams.

Whether Scottish, English or Welsh, the British have one thing in common: a cheeky and sarcastic sense of humour. Whether you're watching a soccer match with friends or enjoying an afternoon tea with your host family, a sense of humour and mockery are always on the menu. Don't take yourself too seriously on a program in the United Kingdom!

School life

The United Kingdom's school year begins between mid-August and early September and ends between late June and mid-July, with a summer break in between.

The school system varies according to the region of the United Kingdom in which you will be placed: England, Scotland or Wales. Students attend Secondary School from ages 11 to 16, then the final two years, known as Sixth Form, from ages 16 to 18. Most schools require students to wear a school uniform

In the United Kingdom, you may start your day with a hearty breakfast of cereals, eggs, bacon, sausages and a glass of orange juice or tea. Your day starts at 9am and finishes around 3pm, with a 15-minute mid-morning break and a lunch break at midday. Each class lasts between 45 minutes or 1 hour. The afternoon is devoted to homework and extracurricular activities.





ABOUT STUDY ABROAD

Study Abroad programs offer a very similar experience to Student Exchange programs, with placement in a host family and enrolment in a local school. However, host families are receiving a payment or a subsidy from our overseas partner organisation and tuition fees may be charged by the host school.

FAQ



The most frequently asked questions by our students and their parents.

WHAT ARE THE ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN A WEP PROGRAM?

Sound academic performance reflected by passing grades in core subjects and teacher recommendations. Minimum C grade average required. Please note that the USA does not accept failing grades. In an English speaking country, students are required to maintain passing grades whilst overseas. In non-English speaking countries, students are expected to display a concerted, conscientious approach to their schoolwork and learning the local language.

DO STUDENTS HAVE TO REPEAT SCHOOLING ONCE THEY RETURN?

Typically, students embarking on a WEP program during years 9–10 will not have to repeat the Australian schooling that they'll miss, while students in years 11 and 12 tend to opt for short term programs over the Australian summer. Students should discuss plans with their school before applying. WEP Australia can give no assurances about whether or not students will be required to repeat study or not.

WILL I BE ABLE TO CONTACT WEP AUSTRALIA 24/7?

We pride ourselves on our openness and accessibility as an organisation. We are available to parents and students from the moment of enquiry until long after a student's return. In the event of an emergency, students and parents are able to call an emergency phone number that is answered 24/7.

WHAT IF A STUDENT HAS A PROBLEM WITH THEIR HOST FAMILY?

Most problems encountered are due to cultural differences and miscommunication. Students have access to competent, knowledgeable people at all times. Local coordinators, host organisations and WEP Australia play a significant role in advising and supporting students and ensuring they are happy living with their host families. When problems cannot be resolved, a change of host family is possible.

WHAT AIRLINES DOES WEP USE?

As WEP Australia is not a travel agent, we have no ties to any particular airline. We only make bookings with reputable carriers.

WHAT IF OUR FAMILY ALREADY KNOWS A POTENTIAL HOST FAMILY?

It may be possible for students to live with a family that they already know. However, the family will have to be approved, prepared and supported by our partner organisation in the same manner as any host family and school enrolment must be available. Students cannot live with family relatives.

WILL OUR FAMILY HAVE TO HOST IN RETURN?

No, your family will not be required to host an exchange student in return. WEP Australia, however, would be grateful if your family did consider offering another student the same hospitality and care that you will receive. Hosting offers enormous benefits to all concerned. See the section on hosting on pages 30-31 of this brochure or visit our website.

CAN PARENTS AND FRIENDS VISIT STUDENTS WHILE THEY ARE OVERSEAS?

Parents and friends are not permitted to visit students while on the program. Our experience shows that such visits unsettle students and interrupt schooling. If time and visa conditions allow (airline tickets are only valid for 12 months), parents may meet the student after the program end date. Students will only be allowed to visit friends or family if approved by our partner organisation and host family.

WHAT DOES THE TRAVEL INSURANCE POLICY COVER?

The policy, included in the program fee, is comprehensive. It includes cover for medical, baggage, accident and public liability.

IS IT SAFE?

The safety of our students is our highest priority. However, it is normal to feel concerned about students embarking on an overseas program. While overseas, a host family, local coordinator and our partner organisation will provide comprehensive support.

HOW MUCH POCKET MONEY SHOULD STUDENTS HAVE ACCESS TO?

Students should have access to at least AUD \$500 a month to pay for personal items, lunches taken at school, books, entertainment, a phone plan, school trips etc. In some countries, the cost of living is considerably higher than in Australia. When exchange rates are taken into account, it may be possible that students need more than the average amount. Additionally students should have access to AUD \$650 for initial purchases on arrival in their host country.

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO?

WEP Australia is a not-for-profit student exchange organisation. We work with independent international partners to organise WEP programs. As a result, the program fee is based solely on the cost of program components, both in Australia and overseas.



The portion of the fee going to the overseas organisation (approx 50%) subsidises the recruitment, screening, criminal background checks, appointment and orientation of the volunteer host family, facilitation of host school enrolment, recruitment and training of the local coordinator, arrival orientation, supervision of your program and provision of 24/7 support while you are in your host country. The portion of the fee going to WEP Australia (approx 25%) subsidises the organisation of your program from the Australian end, ensuring your application is processed, assessed and prepared for the international organisation and you are interviewed in a timely manner, provision of a departure orientation and resource materials, bookings of relevant domestic and international airfares to and from your final destination, detailed assistance with the visa process (where applicable), registration for a comprehensive medical/liability/baggage insurance policy, and support 24/7 in Australia. The portion of the fee set aside for flights and insurance is approximately 25%.

Hosting an international student encourages families to see Australia in a new and delightful way. It provides an opportunity to show off Australian customs, teach the local lingo, visit new places and revisit favourite hang-outs and most important of all, to gain a new family member and friend for life.

Overseas students arrive in Australia in January, April, July, and October and come from many different countries for varying program lengths (from 2 to 11 months). Caring, volunteer host families provide nurturing, supportive home environments and three meals a day.

Although hosting is not a requirement of your outbound program, it is rewarding to be able to provide the same hospitality and care to an international student as a host family will provide for you.

ABOUT HOSTING

Families and students who participate in student exchange discover that, although the world is vast and full of many different cultures and languages, people everywhere share similar hopes and goals for the future. WEP host families are curious, open and tolerant. They are keen to discover another culture, another way of life, another way of thinking and other traditions and practices. Hosting a student allows families to bypass busy airports and travel from the comfort of their own armchair.

WEP's wonderful host families come from all walks of life. They live:



And everywhere in between!

Host families may have children or may not, they may be young or they may be older. In selecting a host family, WEP Australia gives priority to the following characteristics:

- A real and profound desire to become involved in the hosting experience
- An openness and flexibility of approach and attitude
- A desire to learn more about other cultures
- A willingness to obtain a Working with Children Check.

The majority of WEP exchange students are aged between 15 and 18 years. Most students come from European countries. Host families choose the student that they wish to open their home and heart to!

Government regulations dictate that host families are not remunerated for hosting WEP exchange students. Students pay for the cost of their exchange program, including the cost of transport between their country of origin and Australia and health insurance. We ask families to house and feed the student, but above all to share the local life. The student must pay for their telephone usage, school materials, local transportation costs and, in general, all expenses that are not the family's usual expenses. The students will also have their own pocket money.





I would recommend the experience of hosting to anyone. It is such a rewarding experience, for everyone involved. The student, the children of the host family, the family of the student, and of course, me as a host mother. I feel blessed that I have been allowed to "borrow" someone else's son, and am sad to "give him back".
