The Rugby World Cup is the third-largest sporting event in the world, behind only the FIFA Soccer World Cup and the Olympic Games - a testament to the game's global reach and universal appeal.

With Australia set to host the Rugby World Cup in 2027, there has never been a more exciting time for young Australians to get involved in the game. For our students, it's a chance to be part of a global movement and to dream big, to play, watch, and be inspired by the world's best on home soil.

Pathways and Possibilities

Rugby at Trinity opens doors far beyond the school gates. For some, it may lead to representative honours or international touring opportunities, giving students a taste of rugby on the world stage. For others, it may open academic pathways abroad, with an increasing number of UK and USA universities/Colleges now offering College Rugby Scholarships that combine study and sport at an elite level. These scholarships recognise not only athletic ability but also academic performance, leadership, and character, all qualities nurtured through our Rugby Program.

Trinity College is in the process of forming a partnership with First Point USA who will be visiting in March 2026 for a scouting trip for potential players. Past 1st XV Captain Jacob Partington (Class of 2023) successfully gain a scholarship to McKendree University in St. Louis Illinois.

Coaching Excellence - Guided by Experience
