Students enrolled at the College have the privileged opportunity to engage in both curriculum courses, either in the General or ATAR pathways, and vocational studies simultaneously.

With a unique timetable providing them exposure to a range of courses, students are prepared for outstanding post school options. Students have the potential to achieve their WACE as well as Certificates in Automotive, Engineering, Horse Care, Forestry, Conservation and Ecosystem Management.

Students achieve their



competencies for their vocational studies while working in outstanding industry equivalent facilities as well as on our 560 hectare property. All students also have the potential to receive either a Certificate II or Certificate III in Agriculture.

This is achieved by attending our farm program and working in the enterprise areas of beef, dairy, sheep, horticulture, viticulture, machinery and bee-keeping.

As an independent public school, and registered training organisation, it is the intention of the college to ensure students gain meaningful careers in their preferred course of study.

The college works hard to offer attractive career options, including a strong ATAR program

for students attaining a high academic performance who are considering attending university after completion of Year 12.

With committed staff, excellent facilities and a well ordered environment in which to thrive, the college aims to ensure students reach their full potential.

WACoA Denmark has a record of outstanding academic achievement, with some ATAR students entering medicine, vet science, agribusiness and agricultural science upon completion of their studies.

The opportunity to mix academic studies with hands-on work on the college farm has proved time and again to be a recipe for excellent results for the college's ATAR students.
