

# School Uniform Policy

Ratified by Governing Council 3/12/2025

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**Please note:** *This is an interim policy during the transition to our new uniform. All students are required to be in the new uniform by Term 1, 2028.*

## Rationale

Greenwith Primary School values its uniform as an important part of our school identity. Wearing the uniform promotes pride, belonging and unity within the school community. It ensures students are easily identified on excursions and in public, supporting their safety and supervision.

The uniform also encourages equality by reducing competition over clothing and creating a neat, consistent appearance. It is practical, supports students' health and safety, and reflects the high standards of our school. For these reasons, the school uniform is a valued and essential part of life at Greenwith Primary School.

## The OLD School Uniform approved by the Governing Council is:

- Greenwith Polo Top
- Greenwith Logo Long Sleeve Top
- Greenwith Windcheater (Boss Top)
- Greenwith Button-Up Top (Baseball Jacket)
- GPS Navy Puffer Jacket or plain navy jacket
- GPS Navy Puffer Vest or plain navy vest
- Navy blue mid-thigh shorts or full length pants (excludes bike shorts)
- Navy blue mid-thigh skorts, skirts or 3/4 pants
- Greenwith Summer dress – blue, jade and gold with a jade collar
- Greenwith Winter Tunic– navy, jade and gold pinafore
- Navy blue Skivvy (to be worn under polo or long sleeve top)
- Socks must be white, black or navy. Stockings or tights must be navy.
- Approved Hat
- Navy Beanie
- GPS Brand Beanie

## The NEW School Uniform approved by the Governing Council is:

- Greenwith Polo Top
- Greenwith ¼ Zip Jumper
- Greenwith Tricore Jacket
- Navy Blue jacket
- Navy Blue vest
- Navy blue mid-thigh shorts, skorts, leggings or track pants
- Navy blue Skivvy (to be worn under polo)
- Socks must be white, black or navy.
- Approved Hat
- Navy Beanie
- GPS Brand Beanie

### **Shoes**

Students must wear appropriate footwear suitable for physical activity to ensure safe participation in all school activities. Platform shoes and thongs are not permitted.

### **Year 6 Students**

The Year 6 commemorative uniform includes the names of all Year 6 students with the design chosen by the students each year. The polo shirt and ¼ zip jumper are available as part of this uniform range.

### **Hats**

In line with the Sun Protection Policy, all students must wear a school-approved hat in Terms 1, 3 and 4. Acceptable styles include broad-brimmed, bucket or legionnaires hats, without cords or toggles. Students without a hat must remain in shaded areas during play.

Beanies may be worn all year; however, during Terms 1, 3 and 4, a hat must be worn over the beanie when outside. Hats and beanies are not to be worn indoors.

### **Sport's Carnivals**

Students are required to wear the school-issued sports uniform for interschool carnivals and must wear a school-approved hat in Terms 1, 3 and 4.

### **Additional Guidelines**

- Hair longer than shoulder-length must be tied back.
- Hair accessories must be navy blue or jade; hair ties should be plain navy, jade or neutral.
- Scarves, beanies, gloves and headbands must be plain navy blue with no logos or decorations.
- Hijabs must be plain navy blue or black with no logos or decorations.
- Jeans and board shorts are not part of the school uniform.
- Pants or shorts with stripes or visible logos are not permitted.
- Jewellery must be minimal: plain stud or small sleeper earrings, a watch (non-smartwatch), a discreet necklace of personal significance (worn under clothing), a bracelet and no more than one ring. Facial piercings are not permitted.
- Coloured nail polish or makeup is not allowed unless medically required.

### **Non-Compliance**

Students not wearing the correct uniform will be provided with a second-hand uniform for the day and a reminder slip will be sent home. Families of students who repeatedly do not follow the uniform policy will be contacted by their class teacher, and if necessary, by the Leadership team.
