

# **2025 Parent Payment Arrangements**

Dear Parent/Carer,

The purpose of this letter is to notify you of the parent payment arrangements for next year.

Warrnambool East Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of your child's voluntary financial contributions for 2025.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

#### **Financial Support for Families**

Warrnambool East Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- The Camps, Sports and Excursions fund (CSEF) Families who qualify with a health care card may access CSEF funding towards camps, swimming, and excursions. Application for this will be required each year and parents will be advised when applications are accepted. For each primary school student who qualifies, the school will receive \$150 which will be credited towards sport, swimming, excursions and camps.
- School Savings Bonus (SSB) In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus. The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.
- State Schools Relief SSR provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist), on the advice of the school. Schools are able to submit an application directly, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.
- Second hand uniforms onsite (when available)
- We encourage payment plans and can have money directed from Centrelink using Centrepay.

# **ONE PAGE OVERVIEW**

## **FREE INSTRUCTION**

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

# PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

# Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



## FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



# SCHOOL PROCESSES
