Apprenticeship Central

Apprenticeships and traineeships let you earn a nationally recognised qualification while getting real work experience with an employer. You'll learn practical, industry skills, get paid and make valuable contacts for the future. Some are part-time and can be started while you are still at school, usually involving one paid workday each week. Funded by the Australian Government, the program offers mentoring, resources and a supportive network of other women beginning their trade careers. Group Training Organisations - Why register?

Registering with a Group Training Organisation (GTO) can be a great way to find an apprenticeship or traineeship. GTOs employ apprentices and trainees, then place them with host employers while you complete your training. They can also provide extra support and help you gain experience in different workplaces. Living away from home allowance (LAFHA)

The Living Away from Home Allowance (LAFHA) is an allowance for eligible Australian Apprentices who must move away from their parents' or guardians' home to take up or retain an Australian Apprenticeship. This allowance is available to eligible full-time and part-time apprentices during the first three years of their apprenticeship. LAFHA is paid in arrears at the following rates:

- First 12-month period from the date of commencement: \$120.00 per week
- Second 12-month period: \$90.00 per week
- Third 12-month period: \$45.00 per week

Thoroughbred Breeders Australia Fast Track traineeship program

A small number of applicants will be selected for this 12-month program, which combines full-time paid work with formal training. Successful applicants will work at a respected stud farm while completing a nationally recognised Certificate III in Horse Breeding. Throughout the program, trainees gain hands-on experience and attend two intensive training blocks to build the knowledge needed to support their on-farm learning. Work experience is a good idea

The best way to find out what a job is really like is to try it for yourself. A lot of people forget this when making career decisions.

You can explore jobs by:

- doing work observation/shadowing for a day or two
- completing work experience
- volunteering
- getting part-time or casual work
- joining groups like Air Force Cadets or St John Ambulance Cadets
- taking part in career programs and projects such as Engineering Link.

Trying a job can help you:

- build hands-on skills and experience
- understand what workplaces are like outside school
- gain referees for your resume
- make contacts that may help you find work in the future.

Griffith University disability support services

The Student Disability and Accessibility Unit at Griffith University supports students with disabilities, injuries and health conditions studying through Griffith University, Griffith College and Open Universities Australia. Their goal is to improve student participation, access, success and support within learning environments. They support students with a wide range of conditions, including:

- neurodiverse conditions such as autism, ADHD, dyslexia and auditory processing disorders
- hearing impairments
- temporary injuries such as broken or sprained limbs, or recovery from surgery or injury
- medical conditions including epilepsy, arthritis, diabetes, multiple sclerosis, neurological conditions and chronic pain
- mental health conditions such as anxiety, depression and bipolar disorder
- mobility issues including back injuries, spinal cord injuries and musculoskeletal conditions
- vision impairments.

Whether your condition is permanent, temporary, episodic or well-managed, it can still be valuable to explore the support available while studying. ABS Labour Force Data - March 2026

The following are the March 2026 Australian Labour Market trends:

- unemployment rate remained at 4.3%.
- participation rate decreased to 66.8%.
- employment increased to 14,767,700.
- employment to population ratio remained at 64.0%.
- underemployment rate remained at 5.9%.
- monthly hours worked increased to 2,016 million.
- full-time employment increased by 52,500 to 10,174,400 people.
- part-time employment decreased by 34,600 to 4,593,300 people.

Career Start supports Queensland job seekers to start their career or move into more skilled roles or full-time employment. You can participate in either a general training pathway or an employment-based apprenticeship or traineeship pathway. You'll receive reduced-cost entry-level training aligned to the skill outcomes required by industry. Career Start provides eligible Queenslanders with:

- access to certificate III qualifications in priority and emerging industries
- access to apprenticeship and traineeship training in priority and emerging industries
- access to lower-level qualifications identified by industry as the entry point for jobs
- expanded access to foundation skills such as language, literacy, numeracy, digital literacy and employability skills
- increased access to training in regional and remote areas
- supported training pathways for women and priority cohorts to take up skilled careers.

VET Myths and Facts

Australia’s vocational education and training (VET) sector delivers strong outcomes for students, industry and the wider economy. However, public perceptions of VET pathways are often very different from the reality of the opportunities and success the sector provides. People often talk about university pathways and VET can sometimes be overlooked as an important post-school option. As a result, many students may not fully explore the valuable career pathways, practical skills and employment opportunities that vocational education can offer. Youth Allowance - Are you eligible?

Government payments and allowances can sometimes be confusing, so it's a good idea to book an appointment with your local Centrelink office to talk through your options. One payment you may be eligible for is Youth Allowance. This payment helps support young people while they study, train or look for work. You may be eligible if you are:

- 16–21 and looking for full-time work
- 18–24 and studying full-time
- 16–24 and completing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship
- 16–17 and independent or needing to live away from home to study
- 16–17, studying full-time and have completed Year 12 (or equivalent)

Make sure you check important application details like minimum age requirements, English subject prerequisites, English language requirements and any course-specific entry scores, prerequisites, auditions, portfolios or fees. What are minimum selection thresholds? Why you need to check!

The minimum selection threshold is the lowest adjusted ATAR/rank that received an offer for a course in the January 2026 offer round. These scores can change each year depending on how many people apply and their results. Literacy and Numeracy requirements for Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) in 2026

To receive a QCE, you must complete enough learning at the required standard, follow the correct study pattern and meet literacy and numeracy requirements. These requirements help make sure you leave school with important skills for work, training and further study.

- The most common way to meet the literacy requirement is by studying QCAA English subjects such as English, Literature or Essential English.
- The most common way to meet the numeracy requirement is by studying QCAA Maths subjects such as General Mathematics, Mathematical Methods, Specialist Mathematics or Essential Mathematics.

Vocational Education and Training (VET) study entry pathway

You can be assigned a selection rank for competitive entry to UQ based on your Vocational and Education Training (VET) study if you have at least one of the following:

- AQF Certificate III (completed) - Tertiary Rank 68
- AQF Certificate IV (completed) - Tertiary Rank 74
- AQF Diploma - Tertiary Rank 82
- sub-bachelor level study (based on the level and duration of study, and your grade point average).

If you're a **current Year 12 student** with a VET qualification, you can use this qualification to apply for entry to UQ **from Semester 2** of the year after you finish Year 12. You must still achieve a pass in any prerequisite subjects. Click [here](#) for more information.
