JCU has a few programs where a combination of a <u>written application</u> and academic results is required for selection including *health science (physician assistant), dentistry, medicine, physiotherapy, and veterinary science*. Students applying for one or more of these courses should take note of the following **Top Tips for Written Applications**:

- **1.** Read and follow the instructions to the letter
- 2. Make sure to sign the Statutory Declaration, and have it witnessed by an authorized person
- **3.** Check and double check before you send your application in, as JCU can only accept one copy of the application per student
- 4. Get the application in before the closing date for everyone's peace of mind
- **5.** Look for opportunities that indicate your commitment/motivation to study health (e.g. work experience, volunteer work, paid employment) etc.
- 6. Complete your answers within the space provided
- 7. Write neatly so your answers can be read
- **8.** Keep abreast of current events as you may be asked to give your opinion on these should you be invited to an interview (medicine specific)
- **9.** Arrange no more than 3 letters of support It is a competitive process so if you are asked to "Provide 3 Recommendations" select your best three as only the first three will be read and any extras will not be considered
- **10.** Remember: your application is heavily weighted to get to interview stage. You must be passionate about indigenous, tropical, and rural health and reflect this in your application

- More than 45,000 students from around the world study at one of VU's many campuses, with its largest one being Footscray Park <u>VU Campuses</u>
- VU has a number of academic colleges including *arts, business, education, engineering, law & justice, science, sport and exercise science* <u>VU Academic Colleges</u>
- VU has very strong industry connections with over 900 industry partnerships, including the Western Bulldogs, Western Health, City West Water, and various others <u>VU</u> <u>Industry Connections</u>
- VU has agreements with over 100 *exchange partner* institutions worldwide <u>VU</u>
 <u>Exchange Partners</u>. Students can gain credit towards their degree by studying for a year or a semester with one of the international exchange partners <u>VU Study on Exchange</u>
- VU is one of only a few universities in Victoria to offer both vocational training (TAFE) and higher education with very accessible transition between courses at all levels. These *pathways* mean that a student's dream qualification is within reach, regardless of their study background, prior experience, or their ATAR score <u>VU Pathways</u>
- VU is one of Australia's leading sports universities <u>VU Leading Sport University</u>
- VU sports students will gain behind-the-scenes access at *Real Madrid Football Club* through a new partnership signed early in 2015 <u>VU Real Madrid Partnership</u>
- Within the Law & Justice College, VU offers a number of courses from certificates and diplomas to postgraduate degrees, giving students more options to achieve their goals while balancing life and study commitments through flexible pathways - <u>VU Law &</u> <u>Justice College</u>
- VU is one of only two universities in Victoria that offers a course in *osteopathy* <u>Osteopathy at VU</u>
- VU is the only university offering a *dermal therapies degree* in Australia <u>VU Dermal</u> <u>Therapies Degree</u>
- VU offers a number of courses linked to clinical practice and have dedicated clinics where current students put into practice that which they have learnt. Courses linked to clinics include *dermal therapies, nutrition, osteopathy, psychology* <u>VU Health Clinics</u>
- In 2018 VU introduced the <u>VU Block Model</u> all bachelor degrees taught at the Melbourne campuses see units delivered in a more focused way, one at a time. Students have more one-on-one time with their educators as they complete each unit, and experience a significantly more immersive, collaborative, and enriching learning experience. Initially for first-year students, the VU Block Model is now offered to students in all degree years.





Institute Snapshot of William Angliss Institute (WAI) in 2020

- With around 23,000 students enrolling each year, WAI offer a broad range of training and education programs including accredited traineeships and apprenticeships, certificates, diplomas and advanced diplomas, short courses, graduate certificates, bachelors, and master's degrees
- WAI has a two campuses Melbourne the city and Lilydale (in partnership with Box Hill Institute), as well as a campus in Sydney. It also has campuses overseas in countries including China, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Singapore
- WAI is one of Australia's largest specialist centres for foods, tourism, hospitality, and events training
- Courses are categorised into various groups:
 - 1. Food Trades and Culinary Arts, Food Science & Technology Foods
 - 2. Tourism, Guiding, Resort Management, Travel & Aviation Tourism
 - 3. Hospitality and Resort & Hotel Management Hospitality
 - 4. Event Management Events
- WAI offers a number of Bachelor's <u>degrees</u> including:
 - 1. Bachelor of Culinary Management
 - 2. <u>Bachelor of Food Studies</u>
 - 3. Bachelor of Tourism and Hospitality Management
 - 4. Bachelor of Resort and Hotel Management
 - 5. Bachelor of Event Management
- WAI also offers *apprenticeships and traineeships* <u>Apprenticeships and Traineeships</u>, as well as numerous <u>short courses</u>
- WAI offers a 6-month <u>Certificate III in Aviation</u> designed to enhance students' opportunities to fulfil their plans to work with an airline as a cabin crew member. The focus of this course is about customer service, and not really about emergency procedures. Topics of study - beverage service, flight retailing, meeting customers, etc. managing disruptive customers, etc.
- Another specialised area WAI offers training in is <u>Resort and Hotel Management</u> and students get to gain specialised industry training and qualifications tailored to particular areas of the industry
- Students keen on the travel and tourism courses offered at WAI might like to access a dedicated blog that provides ongoing snippets of information about students' activities, travels and insights as they proceed through semester <u>Tourism and Travel Blog</u>
- Numerous scholarships are on offer to students each year
- The <u>Angliss International Hotel School</u> offers students a study pathway to take service delivery to a new and luxurious level. Universities in Western Australia

There are *five* universities in Western Australia, one of which – the University of Western Australia – is a member of the Group of Eight universities.

1. Curtin University

It maintains campuses in Malaysia and Singapore while also conducting face-to-face teaching in a number of countries.
