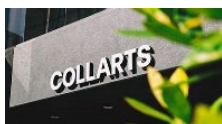

Aspire Community Contribution Program

Open to domestic and international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, VCE minimum prerequisite study scores and ATAR required

At La Trobe, we believe there is more to being a good student than marks alone.

The [Aspire program](#) rewards the skills and knowledge students gain from the positive impact they have made on their school or community through **community service**, **leadership**, or **volunteering**. Designed to give Year 12's the tools they need to succeed at La Trobe and beyond, students accepted into the Aspire program will get:

- *A taste of university life at La Trobe with special on-campus events before the year commences*
- *The chance to meet and connect with like-minded students*
- *Access to exclusive study support resources to help you prepare for exams*
- *Access to La Trobe's extensive library and campus resources*
- *Additional \$1,500 funding for student exchange opportunities, just for being an Aspire student*

Successful applicants also receive their **early conditional offer** late September or early October for their chosen course along with minimum ATAR requirements. Many courses have a minimum ATAR of 55.00, but some professional degree programs have higher requirements.

Up to 40 [Aspire scholarships](#), worth \$5,000 per year for up to four years, will be awarded to leading eligible Aspire students.

The [Aspire ATAR Table](#) shows the minimum ATAR for some degree courses for entry through Aspire in 2024. Should an applicant's preferred course not be listed on this table, then the minimum ATAR is 50.00.

Applicants are required to provide information about the length and frequency of their community service and/or volunteering experience. Applicants will need to provide two 100-word statements responding to the following criteria:

- *List the activities you've been involved in and describe them to us.*
- *How long you've been involved in community engagement and/or volunteering.*
- *Details of your impact (your impact on the community and your own self-development through your actions).*

Types of volunteering include –

- fundraising for charity
- helping to run a school or community club
- coaching a sports team
- volunteering at a nursing home
- mentoring younger students
- leading as a school or house captain

Diploma of Leadership and Management

The Diploma of Leadership and Management has been designed to equip students with important and highly transferrable career skills, spanning:

Students can opt to do the **Essendon Football Club** dual diploma OR the **Cricket Victoria** dual diploma.

Entry into this program requires a successful completion of Year 12.

Career as an Air Attack Supervisor

According to the [Australian Maritime Safety Authority](#), *Air Attack Supervisors are **responsible for the safe and efficient coordination of aerial dispersant application and tactical aircraft activity in support of the incident**. The Air Attack Supervisor is responsible for ensuring safety standards are maintained at all times; for the provision of specialist aviation advice at the incident; and for collaborating in the preparation of Air Operations section of the Incident Action Plan (IAP).*

Students usually get training in this field once they have become qualified [firefighters](#). An interesting article to read is [Being an Air Attack Supervisor](#).

Snapshot of La Trobe University in 2023

- La Trobe is over 50 years old having enrolled its first students in 1967.
- La Trobe University is ranked in the world's top 250 universities by Times Higher Education World University rankings 2022, is one of the world's best young universities, and in the top 1% of universities worldwide - [Rankings & Ratings](#).
- La Trobe has more than 36 000 students and over 3 000 staff, with many [courses](#) on offer including numerous double degree options, and postgraduate courses too.
- La Trobe has three metro and four regional [campuses](#) plus a number of [residential facilities](#).
- Over 50% of students who study at the Bendigo campus come from outside of Bendigo - [La Trobe - Bendigo](#) with over 500 students living on campus - [La Trobe Bendigo Accommodation](#).

- La Trobe’s [Student Excellence Academy](#) provides life changing support and enrichment opportunities that expand on current study and give employment advantages to students.
- La Trobe offers an early admissions program called the [Aspire Early Entry Program](#) which is a way to access an adjusted Aspire ATAR for a preferred course and secure an early conditional offer. There are multiple streams to choose from, so students who give back to their community and achieved good results in Year 11, may be offered a place in their preferred course before they complete Year 12. These students are also eligible for [one of 40 Aspire Scholarships](#).
- There has also been a recent *restructure* of some courses offered in Allied Health - [Health](#).



New Bachelor of Occupational Therapy at Deakin in 2024

We are very excited to announce that the Bachelor of Occupational Therapy will be offered at our Warrnambool campus from Trimester 1, 2024, in addition to the Geelong Waterfront campus. Those students who are passionate about promoting good health and wellbeing and improving people's quality of life, Deakin's [Bachelor of Occupational Therapy](#) will equip them with the knowledge and skills to identify people's strengths and limitations, environmental and social supports and barriers, and the role these play in people's ability to participate in occupations meaningful to them.

With job opportunities in the sector expected to grow by 23.3% by 2026, students will graduate career-ready with the expertise to develop personalised, evidence-based intervention plans with people whose health and wellbeing is affected by issues including injury, illness, disability or environmental barriers. Students will participate in 1000 hours of practice education placement, giving them invaluable hands-on experience.

Students attending schools in a regional or rural area students will also be able apply for this course through Deakin's [Regional and Remote Entry Scheme](#) so they can improve people's quality of life in their own communities.



New Courses in 2023

ACU has introduced three *new* course offerings in 2023. These are:

- The [Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching \(Secondary\)](#) – this is an initial teacher education course. It is fast-tracked so students will be able to graduate with an undergraduate degree and a postgraduate teaching qualification in just four years. The course provides students with an innovative pathway into becoming a secondary school teacher with two specialist teaching areas.

- The [Bachelor of Arts \(Western Civilisation\)/Master of Teaching \(Secondary\)](#) offered at the Sydney campus, is a double degree that allows students to pursue a multidisciplinary Bachelor of Arts with a focus on key texts of the Western intellectual tradition, followed by a Master of Teaching (Secondary) enabling them to become a fully qualified secondary teacher in two teaching methods.
- The [Bachelor of Human Rights](#) is an exciting new course that will prepare students for a career in human rights and social justice. Human rights is a highly significant and swiftly growing field of domestic and global research and practice within law, criminal justice, history, philosophy and politics. This course can be combined with a Bachelor of Laws - [Bachelor of Human Rights/Bachelor of Laws](#) or Criminology and Criminal Justice - [Bachelor of Human Rights/Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice](#) to further expand career prospects.



Victoria Police's Forensic Service Department (FSD)

The **Victoria Police's Forensic Service Department (FSD)** is split across three locations in Victoria - Macleod, Ballarat, and Morwell, and FSD is one of the largest providers of forensic science services in Australia.

This department is made up of a diverse mix of *scientists* and *specialist police officers*, who provide high level forensic analysis to assist police with evidence recovery, intelligence, investigations, and prosecutions.

Specialist areas include just about everything from *DNA extraction* and *drug and chemical analysis*, to *botany*, *ballistics*, and *audio-visual recovery and enhancement*.

Students keen on a career in forensic science should note that there are two main pathways that could lead to their dream job at Victoria Police's Forensic Services Department:

1. Study a science degree at university specialising in either chemistry, biochemistry, or molecular biology.
2. Join Victoria Police as a police officer.
