WORK EXPEREINCE

The Endeavour Workshop still remains a strong community partnership for our senior secondary students. Weekly we have students attend with an Educational Assistant where routine work tasks and procedures are practiced.

OurSpace and IGA Dean Street are other community site that is currently supporting RNSS students for work experience opportunities.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION & TRAINING (VET):

In partnership with their cohort peers, students completing a Cert I course lead the maintenance & planning within the greenhouse & garden precinct.
