### "Stop being disrespectful!"

Often, we think our children KNOW exactly what we expect from them. But they might not unless we TALK about it.

#### Respect is about showing we care about:

- the feelings and needs of PEOPLE
- the rules and order of PLACES
- the protection and importance of THINGS



We can replace the word "respect" with the words "care about":

"I respect your feelings."



"I care about your feelings."

### Discuss what respect LOOKS LIKE in your family or classroom.

Let's talk about people and things we care about. How can you tell someone is treating you or your things with care?

### Discuss what respect FEELS like for each of you.

What does feeling respected mean for each one of us? I feel respected when someone speaks calmly to me.

#### Brainstorm examples of ways you can SHOW RESPECT to others:

- Try to understand others' point of view.
  Ask, "Is this okay?" if you're unsure.
- Use kind words and tones of voice.
- Offer help when you see someone struggle.

### Looks Like $\rightarrow$

- Patiently listening when someone else is talking
- · Holding the door open for someone else
- Cleaning up after ourselves and keeping our space tidy
- Cheering for others when they succeed AND when they don't
- Saying "please" and "thank you"

### Sounds Like ->

- Using kind words and a gentle tone when speaking to others
- · Apologizing when we make a mistake or hurt someone
- Encouraging our friends and classmates when they're feeling down
- Honoring other people's opinions, even if we don't agree with them

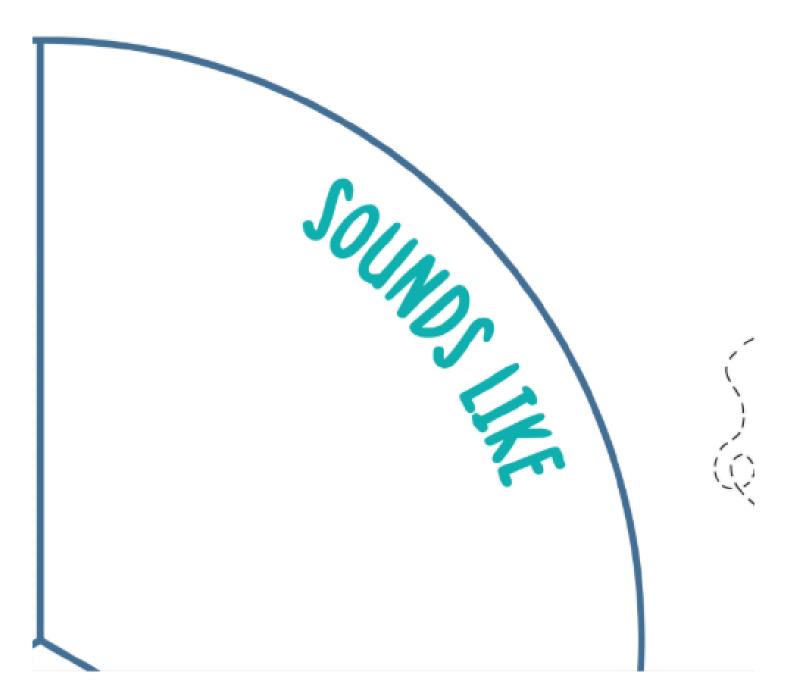
### Feels Like
