ABS Labour Force Data - July 2024

The Australian Bureau of Statistics has released its <u>Labour Force Data for July 2024</u>:

- Unemployment rate increased to 4.2%.
- Participation rate increased to 67.1%.
- Employment increased to 14,462,100.
- Employment to population ratio increased to 64.3%.
- Underemployment rate remained at 6.4%.
- Monthly hours worked increased to 1,960 million.

Through Fee-Free TAFE, the Australian Government in partnership with States and Territories are providing 480,000 Fee-Free TAFE places between 2023 and 2026. As part of 2024-25 Budget, the Australian Government announced funding for an additional 20,000 construction sector Fee-Free TAFE and vocational education and training places, including up to 5,000 pre-apprenticeship places, to be delivered in partnership with States and Territories from January 2025. 2024 Real Futures' Grant

The Real Futures Grant is awarded annually to one person and is worth \$5,000. Applications for the 2024–25 grant are now open. Entry is open to residents or permanent residents of Australia who are domestic undergraduates and aged 18 years old and over at the date they submit their entry. Eligibility is limited to those studying a certificate, diploma, degree or traineeship in one or more of the following fields:

- Business including any business-related courses from any institution.
- Finance including actuarial, statistics, accounting and general finance courses.
- Medicine including medical and health sciences, surgery and medical research.
- Healthcare including health and fitness-related specialties, sport sciences, health services assistance and international health.
- Specialist healthcare including nursing, optometry, dentistry and pharmacy.

To enter the Real Futures Grant, your challenge is to write an essay (maximum 700 words) on why you want to work in your selected industry and the difference you hope to make in your particular field of study. Commonwealth Scholarships

There are three types of Commonwealth scholarships:

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<u>Student Start-Up Loan</u> – Available to eligible full-time students in higher education who receive Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY Living Allowance and you must apply.

<u>Relocation Scholarship</u> – This is an annual payment to help eligible ABSTUDY or Youth Allowance students with their higher education if they have relocated to, or from, a regional or remote area to study.

<u>Payments and support for Indigenous Australians</u> - You may be eligible if you're studying or training. ABSTUDY is a group of payments for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students or apprentices.

Corporate Partners in Excellence Scholarship

QUT's <u>Corporate Partners in Excellence (CPIE) Scholarship</u>, valued at \$42,000, offers students two 15-week internships with QUT corporate partners and automatic membership to the QUT College of Excellence. <u>Applications close 8 October 2024</u>.

New higher education students (domestic and onshore international) will need to apply for or have a USI before University census date early in Semester 1 2025. New students applying for <u>Commonwealth financial assistance</u> will be required to provide their USI on their Commonwealth Assistance Form (CAF or eCAF), to be able to receive financial assistance (like a <u>HELP loan</u>). Educational Access Scheme (EAS)

EAS can assist if you have faced challenging circumstances that have affected your most recent schooling or study experience. It supports you by levelling the playing field to give you a better chance to compete for tertiary study. All applicant information is treated with strict confidentiality and care. EAS can assist you if:

- You have qualifications that provide a QTAC selection rank. This includes completing senior secondary schooling (years 11 and 12) or other equivalent studies.
- You are applying for an institution or course that accepts EAS.
- You meet entry requirements even if you changed school subjects, as long as the new subjects align with the course requirements.
- You have missed school due to circumstances beyond your control, not including personal choice activities like sports, music, or cultural events.

If your EAS application is successful, you may receive adjustments to your QTAC selection rank. This can help you compete for tertiary study on a more equal basis. If you are eligible for the Financial Hardship category, you may also get financial assistance from institutions, such as scholarships or bursaries. How are IB Diploma students considered for entry to tertiary courses in Australia?

Results from completed IB Diplomas are reported as an IB Score called the IBAS, on a whole number scale between 24 and 45. These IBAS are then converted into a national ATAR-like rank to allow IB students to be considered for tertiary places alongside their counterparts who have completed state curricula or other qualifications. This national ATAR-like value is known as the Combined Rank because it is a national conversion which combines results from across all states. This means that IB students can apply in any Australian state or territory with confidence about how their results compare to their peers who have completed state curricula and received an ATAR. Pros and cons of mid-year entry

Many tertiary courses have Semester 1 and Semester 2 entry. This means you can commence your course at the beginning of the year or mid-year. The following is a list of some of the advantages and disadvantages of applying mid-year.

Advantages

- You can have a longer break from study between finishing Year 12 and starting tertiary study halfway through the following year (like a mini Gap year).
- Mid-year entry allows you to apply again if you don't get a course for Semester 1.
- Starting mid-year gives you a chance to improve your skills by doing a study preparation course or short-lower level course during Semester 1.
- Starting mid-year does not necessarily mean you take longer to graduate as many courses offer catch-up options such as summer schools/Trimester 3 study options.

Disadvantages

- Not all courses offer mid-year entry.
- ATAR/tertiary rank minimum thresholds can be more competitive mid-year because there are usually fewer places available.

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- You could regret not starting your study earlier when you see your friends starting their courses in Semester 1.
- You might get out of the study habit.
- You could become bored and end up wasting your time.

A sensible strategy is to apply for Semester 1 courses and defer your study. Also, you could contact the admissions office of the institution to find out the process to defer for six months instead of a year, which is the usual deferment period.

QTAC website has the most up to date course information

It is important to remember that the 2025 QTAC course guide was accurate on the day of publishing. Some courses have been approved since publication and/or were not included in the book at time of publication. The QTAC and university websites are the most accurate source of course information so check, check and double check your facts!

To get your ATAR you HAVE TO register with QTAC

If you are in Year 12 and are ATAR eligible, to receive your ATAR in December, you must register now on the ATAR Portal to have QTAC calculate your ATAR. Year 12 Queensland 2024 ATARs will be released into the portal from 8am - 9am on Friday 13 December. If you are planning on applying for courses in 2025, you will also need to submit a separate QTAC application.

If you are wanting to apply interstate, you will also be required to register on the ATAR portal providing QTAC with the necessary consent to share your ATAR with interstate Tertiary Admissions Centres. Before registering on the portal, you will need the following information:

- Full name (as shown on QCAA Learning Account/official school enrolment)
- Date of Birth (DD, MM, YYYY)
- LUI number
- Personal email address

<u>The Student Portal</u> delivers all your learning information and final results in one place. You can check your personal details, access your learning account, get your final Year 12 results and more. **You need to register!** You will need an email address **(NOT** your school email) and your LUI number. The Student Portal gives you secure access to your personal learning information. The first stage includes three features:

- My Details is where you'll see your personal details and you can update your email address and/or mobile phone number
- My Learning Account is where you'll find your subject and course enrolments and get your final
 results at the end of Year 12. Results will be displayed as they become available including any VET
 qualifications and QCE recognised studies once they are entered by the learning provider.
- My Online Learning is where you can complete the QCAA academic integrity course and print a certificate of completion.

What qualifications will I get at the end of Year 12?

On 13 December 2024, you will be able to log into your <u>QCAA Student Portal</u> to see your final subject results located in your learning account. If eligible, you will be issued with a senior education profile. Included in this profile could be:

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- Senior Statement this is a transcript of your learning account. The Senior Statement shows all QCE contributing studies and the results achieved that may contribute to the award of a Queensland Certificate of Education. If you receive a Senior Statement, then you have satisfied the completion requirements for Year 12 in Queensland.
- Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) The QCE is Queensland's senior school qualification and is awarded to eligible students, usually at the end of Year 12.
- Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) The Queensland Certificate of Individual
 Achievement (QCIA) recognises the achievements of students who are on individualised learning
 programs.



How to retain information

Ebbinghaus was a German psychologist who studied memory. He discovered the forgetting curve which looks at the decline of memory retention. It showed that forgetting occurs most rapidly shortly after you stop learning a subject. The greatest loss is within a few hours. The speed you forget gradually slows down as time goes on. Visit The Ebbinghaus Forgetting Curve-And How To Overcome It for more information about the forgetting curve. Two strategies for memory retention are:

- Better memory representation (e.g. mnemonic techniques) Coming up with a song is a commonly used mnemonic technique. An example is how children remember their ABCs. Other types include names, expressions, models, odes, note organisation, images, connections and spellings. An example of using a name as a mnemonic is Roy G Biv (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet) to remember the colours of the rainbow.
- Repetition based on active recall (especially spaced repetition) When learning new information, spacing out revision sessions over time makes items easier to remember. It is more effective to do your revision over many weeks, rather than the night before the exam. Plan your review of material to start the first day after it is acquired, a second time about a week after that and finally a few weeks later. This is what you do in the revision part of homework. Active recall means that you test yourself following each revision session.

Admission schemes and adjustment factors/points

Admission schemes can boost your selection rank and improve your chances of getting into your preferred program. You may be eligible for UQ's admission schemes based on:

- your background and personal circumstances
- · where you live
- the subjects you studied at school.

Many of the admission schemes use 'adjustments' to boost your selection rank. If you're eligible for adjustments, your entry score/ATAR will be converted to a selection rank and any adjustments will be added onto this rank. Each adjustment is equivalent to 1 rank. You can receive a maximum of 5 adjustments across all the following schemes.

- <u>School Opportunity Scheme</u> Depending on the school you attend, you may be eligible for up to 4 rank adjustments.
- Rural Access Scheme If you've lived in a rural area in Australia, you may be eligible to receive 2 adjustments towards your selection rank for all undergraduate programs.
- <u>UQ Link Program</u> If you've experienced significant financial disadvantage, you may be eligible to receive 5 adjustments towards your selection rank and a \$3000 scholarship.
- <u>Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Admission Pathway</u> If you're an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person, you may be eligible for support to help you get into your preferred UQ program.
- <u>Undergraduate Law Admission Scheme</u> If you're from an educationally disadvantaged or culturally diverse background, you may be eligible for support to help you get into our undergraduate law programs.
- <u>Subject Incentive Scheme</u> If you're a Year 12 student studying certain subjects at school, you may be eligible for up to 5 adjustments towards your selection rank.
- <u>Educational Access Scheme</u> QTAC's Educational Access Scheme can provide additional support if you've experienced difficult personal circumstances that have negatively affected your most recent studies.
