Mordialloc Freeway

Major Road Projects Authority (MRPA) is responsible for the planning and delivery of the new 9 kilometre Mordialloc Freeway, which will link the Mornington Peninsula Freeway at Springvale Road to the Dingley Bypass. This will create one continuous freeway from Frankston to Clayton by:

- building bridges over Springvale, Governor, Lower Dandenong and Centre Dandenong Roads, along with new freeway entry and exit ramps
- building bridges over Old Dandenong Road and sensitive waterways area
- connecting the freeway to Dingley Bypass with traffic lights

As part of the project MRPA will also:

- upgrade the existing interchange at Thames Promenade, Chelsea, with the Mornington Peninsula Freeway, along with freeway entry and exit ramps
- build a new shared walking and cycling path along the entire freeway.

The project is currently undergoing an Environment Effects Statement (EES) as part of the planning. The EES enables a transparent and rigorous process for the potential impacts of the project and to ensure they are managed appropriately. It also enables you to have your say on what matters to you most.

MRPA engaged independent consultants to complete 13 key studies as part of the EES, which include biodiversity, noise, traffic and land use. The outcomes of these studies have helped to shape the Mordialloc Freeway.
