MSL

This term during **Multisensory Structured Learning (MSL)** students will be covering a variety of different spelling rules.

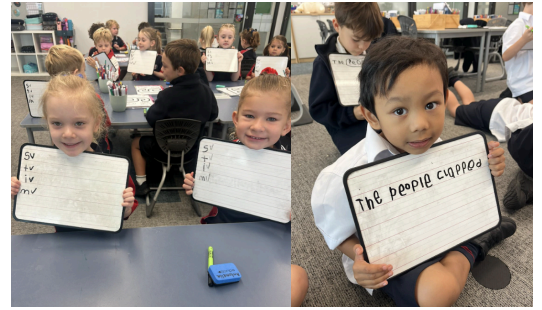
- Revision of single sounds
- Consonant digraphs (sh, ch, th, wh, ph)
- Syllable types; closed, open and silent 'e'
- Recognising common high-frequency words

The Writing Revolution

This term we are continuing on with our explicit teaching of **The Writing Revolution (TWR)** lessons.

This term focuses on:

- Identifying and defining nouns
- Identifying and defining verbs
- Constructing simple sentences
- Expanding sentences to include; when, who and where



Mathematics

This term, we will continue to practise mental and written mathematical strategies through our Ochre Daily Reviews. Students will engage in a range of activities, including answering questions on individual whiteboards, sharing patterns and thinking, participating in discussions, and following along with whole-class reading and tracking. We will incorporate daily number fluency practice to build students' confidence and accuracy with key number facts. Developing number fluency supports quicker recall, reduces cognitive load during problem-solving, and strengthens overall mathematical understanding.

- Counting and place value
- Combining and partitioning
- Location and shape

Topic: Family Celebrations, Five Senses, Movement

This term, we will be exploring three units across Humanities and Science. In Humanities, students will learn about family celebrations, recognising special events in their own lives and exploring how different families and cultures celebrate in diverse ways, including First Nations perspectives. In Science, we will investigate the five senses and how they help us understand the world around us, as well as explore movement by observing how different objects and living things move and what factors affect this. Through hands-on activities, students will build their curiosity, observation skills, and understanding of the world around them.

Religion

This term we are learning about the story of Creation, exploring how God made the world and everything in it. We pray together daily and take part in school Masses and liturgies throughout the term, helping us grow in our faith and connection to God.

Respectful Relationships, Positive Coping and Help Seeking

This term, we will continue Respectful Relationships lessons and integrate the Berry Street Educational Model into our wellbeing focus. Students will reflect on emotions, express feelings with awareness of others, and practise techniques to manage fear, frustration, and anger. They will also learn problem-solving, ways to care for others, and the importance of seeking help.
