






Archbishops are in charge of the Bishops in his part of the country. This is called an archdiocese.

A bishop is the leader of the Church in a large part of the country, called a diocese.







Every Cardinal writes the name of the man he would like to be Pope on a piece of paper.

Each Cardinal walks to the altar and puts the paper in a gold cup.

The votes are counted.



After the votes are counted the papers are burned.

If a Pope has not been chosen, dye is put into the fire with the papers and black smoke puffs out of the chimney.

The Cardinals must vote again.



When the Cardinals have chosen a Pope the papers are burned without the dye. White smoke comes out of the chimney and a new Pope has been chosen.




The new Pope selects a name and is fitted into his papal robes. He is then presented at the balcony of St Peter's Basilica.

The senior cardinal announces "Habemus Papam" - We have a new Pope!


