

Carrum Station opens

The new Carrum Station will open from the first service, Monday 17 February when trains resume on the Frankston line. From Monday 17 February, access to the station will be from the southern entrance via a new pedestrian connection across Station Street at Walkers Road. Access to the platform will be via the lift or stairs.

Over the coming months, the project team will continue works around the station forecourts, platforms and broader station precinct, including opening the main station entrance at McLeod Road, kiosk, station office, waiting room and car parking by mid-2020.

There will be signage in place and staff on the ground to help locals get familiar with the new conditions.

Bicycles, dogs (with the exception of animals identified by an Assistance Animal Pass) and surfboards are not allowed on train replacement buses.

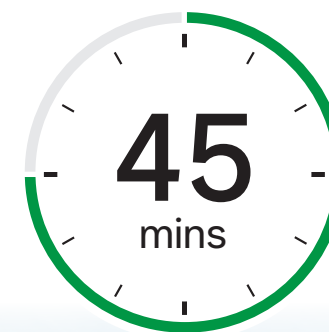
Ticketing

Removing your Cheltenham, Mentone and Carrum level crossings

The Level Crossing Removal Project is removing 18 level crossings and building 12 new stations as part of a \$3 billion upgrade of the Frankston line that will improve safety, reduce congestion and allow more trains to run more often.

Works are underway for the removal of the level crossings at Carrum, Mentone and Cheltenham as well as the construction of the new Carrum Station and a stabling yard in Kananook. In addition, early works have started on the Chelsea, Edithvale and Bonbeach level crossing removals.

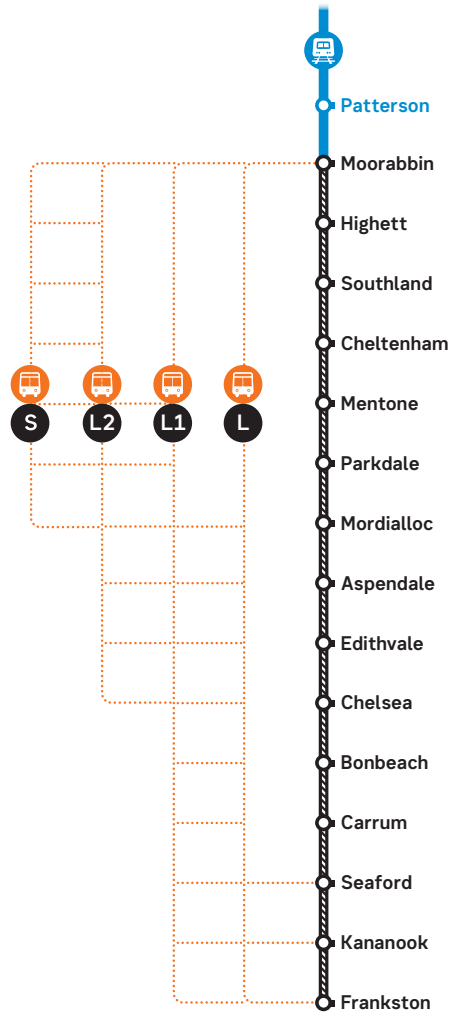

Plan ahead to avoid long delays

During this major disruption, we're giving buses the green light. This means replacement buses will have a smoother journey along key routes, helping traffic flow and getting you where you need to be via the quickest route possible. We estimate an additional 45 minutes will be added to most people's journeys. To help during this time, here are some tips:

- Plan ahead and allow more time for your journey.
- If you can, avoid the peak and consider alternatives where possible.
- Please be aware of more people using alternative roads, train lines or routes, if their usual journey is disrupted.
- Touch on and off on the metropolitan train network before 7.15am to get free travel.

Road Disruptions

To enable extensive level crossing works to take place there will be the following temporary road closures in Cheltenham in early 2020.

- Park Road will be closed between Hall Street and the Cheltenham Park gate from **Wednesday 15 January to Wednesday 22 January**.
- Charman Road will be closed between Station Street and Blagdon Street from **Saturday 1 February to Saturday 7 March**.
