Something to Think About

We can tell from the Bible that Jesus was like us in lots of ways. He had a family, and he liked spending time with friends. Can you think of other ways that Jesus might have been just like you?

The Story

The gospel passage tells us that Jesus' family thought he was 'crazy'. Does your family ever think you do strange things? In today's story, Jesus encourages his listeners to think about 'family' in a new way. He told them that God's kingdom calls us to see and welcome everyone as part of God's family. Jesus said that anyone who obeys God is his brother or sister or mother.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark

3:20-21, 31-35

Jesus went back home, and once again such a large crowd gathered that there was no chance even to eat. When Jesus' family heard what he was doing, they thought he was crazy and went to get him under control.

Jesus' mother and brothers came and stood outside.
Then they sent someone with a message for him to come out to them.
The crowd that was sitting around Jesus told him,
"Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside and want to see you."


Jesus asked, "Who is my mother and who are my brothers?" Then he looked at the people sitting around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers.
