## YEAR 10 CORE SUBJECTS

Students are required to participate in all Year 10 compulsory core subjects:

- English: Language and Literature
- Mathematics- Three ability-based options:
  - Application and Interpretation
  - General Maths
  - Analysis and Approaches in Mathematics
- Religious Education
- Science
- Careers Education
- Leadership Development
- Health and Physical Education





### YEAR 10 MATHEMATICS

Students will be able to choose from three Maths offerings:

- Application and Interpretation of Mathematics: The focus of this course is building students' ability to apply mathematical skills within a real-world context. This course prepares students for the mathematics associated with VET courses and VCE Vocational Major: Numeracy.
- General Mathematics: This course will prepare students for the study of General Mathematics in VCE but is suitable for all students wanting to extend their mathematics knowledge.
- Analysis and Approaches in Mathematics: This course provides a solid basis of understanding for students wishing to pursue Mathematical Methods in VCE. This course explores in more depth abstract concepts such as algebra, probability and statistics and their applications in a variety of practical and theoretical contexts.

If students are unsure which pathway they wish to pursue, we encourage them to chat to their Maths teacher and the Careers Team.

### Yr 10: VCE FAST-TRACKING

The availability of this option will be based on a student's demonstrated readiness to participate in VCE subjects through their results on assessment tasks and work ethic in Year 9.

There are several advantages to completing a VCE Unit 1&2 in Year 10. These include:

- Exposure to the VCE program in Year 10 and the building of student confidence and capacity
- An added challenge for capable students and extension of their knowledge and skills
- A sixth Unit 3&4 subject to contribute to the ATAR in Year 12



### VCE FAST-TRACKING

It is very important that any students considering fast-tracking have read through the VCE Student Handbook, to be aware of the requirements of VCE studies.

Students who decide to pursue a VCE Fast-Track or VET subject in Year 10 must submit an Fast-track Application Form with their subject selections and participate in an interview early in Term 3.



# VCE- Year 11 and 12

Students will access two main pathways in Year 11 and 12:

- Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) Pathway
- Victorian Certificate of Education Vocational Major (VCE-VM) Pathway

In both pathways, students also have access to studying a VET program.

Students also participate in camps, excursions and leadership development opportunities.



### VICTORIAN CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (VCE)

#### OVERVIEW

The Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) is the most commonly studied senior secondary certificate in Victoria. It is a recognised qualification for entry to further studies at University or TAFE and for transition into the workforce.

VCE is a two-year program of study. VCE programs are selected to meet students' individual career and further study preferences.

VCE "studies" (studies can be thought of as subjects) are designed in Units. The majority of studies consisting of four units completed over two years. Units 1&2 are typically completed in Year 11 and Units 3&4 are usually completed in Year 12.





### VICTORIAN CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (VCE)

#### MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR VCE

To be awarded your VCE at the end of Year 12 you must successfully complete a minimum of 16 units that include:

- three units from the English group, two of which must be a Unit 3&4 sequence
- at least three additional Unit 3 and 4 sequences of your choice.

At St Anne's College, students will also complete a Religious Education subject in Year 11 and 12.





#### VCE ASSESSMENT & SATISFACTORY COMPLETION

In Unit 1&2 VCE studies, students are awarded "satisfactory completion" by the school if they meet the requirements of each unit. If they do not meet requirements, they are awarded an N and this subject will not be counted towards the attainment of the student's VCE. The award of an S or an N for each student's VCE units is reported to VCAA and will be shown on the student's Statement of Results.

In Unit 3&4 studies, students undertake formal graded assessments, known as School Assessed Coursework (SAC) and at least one examination (written, oral or performance exams according to the study), which is set and marked by VCAA. In addition to an S or an N, student performance on each assessment task to reported to VCAA.



### EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS & THE ATAR

Students interested in studying at University after school will need an ATAR to be considered for admission to most University courses.

To earn an ATAR students will be required to successfully complete their VCE units and sit external examinations for their Unit 3&4 subjects.

These examinations occur during October and November of the year in which your child is completing their Unit 3&4 studies.

External examinations are written and marked by VCAA.

A student's performance on their SACs as well as their performance on the external examination will lead to the calculation of a Study Score for each VCE study. Study scores are determined by VCAA.

Study scores calculated by the VCAA will be used by VTAC to calculate the ATAR.



### VCE- An Academic Pathway

This pathway best suits students who plan to complete further studies after school, especially University.

Students who elect to participate in VCE must:

- prioritise school over casual work commitments
- balance school and social commitments
- be willing to complete 2 hours of homework, per subject, per week
- be proactive in seeking support from their teachers
- be receptive to teacher feedback and guidance
- maintain attendance of 85% or above

## VCE VOCATIONAL MAJOR (VCE-VM)

VCE Vocational Major (VCE-VM) is an applied learning pathway within the VCE.

The VCE-VM gives students greater choice and flexibility to pursue their strengths and interests and develop the skills and capabilities needed to succeed in further education, work and life.

The VCE-VM prepares students to move into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education and training, university (via non-ATAR pathways) or into the workforce after school.

Within the VCE-VM, student progress is assessed often on the application of skills and knowledge within meaningful real work contexts.



## VCE VOCATIONAL MAJOR

VCE-VM sits under the same certificate as VCE but students must complete:

- A minimum of 3 units of VCE-VM Literacy or VCE English studies, 2 of which are a Unit 3&4 sequence
- A minimum of 2 units of VCE-VM Numeracy or 2 units from any VCE Mathematics study
- A minimum of 2 Work Related Skills units
- A minimum of 2 Personal Development Skills units
- 180 hours of VET at Certificate II level or above
- A total minimum of 16 units over a minimum two-year timeframe
- A total minimum of 8 units at the Unit 3&4 level completed as 4 sequences.

Students in the VCE-VM may be able to access other VCE Units of study



### VCE- VM: An Applied Learning Pathway

This pathway best suits students who plan to enter the workforce, begin apprenticeships or traineeships or complete further education with TAFE providers after school.

Students who elect to participate in VCE-VM must:

- have a preference for applied learning which will include group work, project work, community service and skills based tasks.
- secure work placements on Fridays during the school term
- enrol in a VET course here at the College or through GoTAFE
- maintain attendance of 85% or above and participate fully in all learning opportunities



### VCE- VM: An Applied Learning Pathway

VCE-VM is structured as follows:

#### Monday, Tuesday and Thursday

Students attend classes here at St Anne's College. These classes include English (VCE-VM Literacy or VCE English), Mathematics (VCE-VM Numeracy or VCE Maths), Work Related Skills (WRS), Personal Development Skills (PDS) and Religious Education. Students also complete micro credentials such as their white card and first aid training.

#### Wednesday

Students attend their VET courses or workplaces if they are engaged in a School Based Apprenticeship/Traineeship. Students completing Cert III Sports, Recreation & Aquatics attend St Anne's College.

#### Friday

Students engage in Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) as organised by the student, with support from the WRS learning mentor and careers practitioners. Students are required to be proactive in following up workplaces to secure placements.

## VCE VET - Vocational Education & Training

VCE VET programs offer students the opportunity to gain both the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE and VCE-VM) and a nationally recognised Vocational Education and Training (VET) certificate.

VCE VET programs:

- Most are fully recognised within the Units 1 to 4 structure of the VCE.
- VCE VET units have the same status as other VCE units and some are eligible for a study score or if not, students will earn a 10% increment.
- VET programs are an essential requirement for the satisfactory completion of the VCE Vocational Major.



## VCE VET - Vocational Education & Training

There are a range of entry-level VET qualifications secondary students can undertake within their school program:

St Anne's has two options to study VET courses:

- Internally, here at St Anne's College
- GOTAFE Shepparton VET Delivered to School Students (VDSS) Program

Most VCE VET courses run over a two-year period, and students need to make the commitment to studying the course for two years, beginning in Yr 11.



# VET @ St Anne's College

#### VETis: Certificate III in Sport Aquatics and Recreation

In the Certificate III in Sport, Aquatics and Recreation, students develop the skills and knowledge across various key areas within the industry, including recreation session delivery, coaching, technology, officiating and working with diverse people.

Students may complete this course and earn a study score that contributes to their ATAR.

# How to apply for VET in 2026

Any students interested in a VET course for 2026:

- 1. Make an appointment with Belinda Gleeson to discuss your interest and suitability for the VET program.
- 2. The school leaders will meet to make a decision around your suitability to engage in a VET course.
- 3. If you are endorsed, you will be provided with an application link (Expression of Interest) in August. You must complete your Expression of Interest via an online form, that includes obtaining an USI and accessing identity documents such as your birth certificate.

Applications for VDSS GOTAFE courses are <u>not</u> available on the Gotafe website.

Please note some courses will have an interview or pre-entry test in the September school holidays as part of the application process

Filling in the 2026 GOTAFE VET Application link does not guarantee you with a VET Program position in 2026. It is the first step of the application process. VET Programs can be cancelled due to lack of numbers which is out the College's control.

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An SBAT is a great option for a student who wants to complete Yr 11 and 12 and begin an apprenticeship or traineeship with an employer. An SBAT will earn a student credit towards their VCE or VCE-VM program.

If you are interested in exploring a School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship, your first action is to make an appointment with Belinda Gleeson. At this meeting Belinda will take you through the process and help you to understand more about the requirements when undertaking the SBAT.

SBATs are offered by employers. Students interested in an SBAT are encouraged to speak to prospective employers and stay updated with offers of employment advertised in via our career's newsletter.





### Work Experience and Structured Workplace Learning

Students in Years 10 - 12 are expected to engage with employers, through Work Experience and Structured Workplace Learning (SWL).

All students in Yr 10 in 2026 are expected to engage in one week of work experience. This will most likely occur during the final week of Term 2 in 2026, Monday 22nd - Friday 26th June.

Students engaged in VET and VCE-VM participate in Structured Workplace Learning. SWL complements the training undertaken at school/GOTAFE and provides context for:

- enhancement of skills development
- practical application of industry knowledge
- assessment of units of competency/modules, as determined by the RTO
- increased employment opportunities.

Structured Workplace Learning is a compulsory part of the VCE-VM program.

# MAKING CHOICES

Choosing a pathway and subjects can be both an exciting and daunting experience for students.

We recommend students make choices that:

- align with their interests
- support the student's current desired career path
- align with areas of the curriculum where the student has previously experienced success
- consider literacy skills- VCE requires strong literacy skills
- provide the ability to open the door to further study at university or TAFE

Ensure you engage in conversations with your child about their choices. You know your child best and will be able to provide them with valuable advice and guidance. *Students and families are welcome to make appointments to speak to our Careers Practitioners to seek advice about pathways and suitable subject selections.* 

All Year 10 students are <u>required</u> to make a careers appointment prior to selecting their pathway for 2026.

Late submission (without a reason) may impact your selection of subjects within the VCE Program.

\*If careers appointments are full, we can extend the submission date for affected students.
