<u>ISA Division 1 – Semi-final. 1st XI</u> (10/110 L Chang 25, A Favelle 18) v St Patrick's College Strathfield (3/114 T McLachlan 1/17) at Breen Oval

The 1st XI went to Strathfield to play the minor premiers St Patrick's in a sudden death semi-final. Tom Colgan won the toss and batted first but early wickets were lost before Joe Colgan (19) and Adam Greenwood (13) consolidated the position. A middle order collapse against a dual spin attack followed. However, some more aggressive batting from Liam Chang (25) and Alec Favelle (18) led a recovery that was continued by Josh Hooper (12) and Tim McLachlan (6*) for the last wicket. A total of 110 was not imposing but it was felt that runs on the board would allow pressure to be placed on the opposition batsmen.



The SPC opening batsmen saw off the 1st XI new ball but a run out by Alec Favelle and two excellent stumpings from Nick McLachlan off the bowling of Tom Colgan (1/32) and Tim McLachlan (1/17) saw the score at 3-45. Could the 1st XI pull off another miracle victory? It was not to be as the next SPC batsmen played attacking cricket and led their team home in the 33rd over.

The 1st XI showed a lot of character and fight throughout the season and can be very proud of their efforts. They were led by a fine captain in Tom Colgan. Seven of the players return next season with the experience of ISA cricket behind them, so there is much promise ahead for SPX Cricket.

This week we travelled to the Southern Highlands to play Chevalier in the semi final and this truly was a competitive game for the SPX 2nd XI cricket team.

Chevalier won the toss and elected to bat. The Chevalier opening batsmen started very positively, setting the pace scoring a four off the first ball. From there they went from strength to strength and at the 8th over mark they were 0-32. It appeared as if they were intending to set a platform for a large total; however full credit to the Pius boys who stuck to their task and the first wicket fell in the 9th over taken by James Power (2/28). In the 16th over another breakthrough with Brad Power (3/28) dismissing the other opening batsman who had been scoring at a rapid rate. Thereafter the Pius boys managed to take wickets at regular intervals to contain the runs. However it was the combination of Logan Nicey (1/12 off 9 overs) and Laurence Sheehan (2/4 off 5.1 overs) who started to turn the game in our favour as they kept the runs to a minimum and applied pressure to the Chevalier batsmen. Chevalier were all out for 151 in the 47th over - this was a solid target but it was definitely within our capability to chase this target down.

At the beginning of our batting innings we lost 2 early wickets but Tom Wunsch came to the crease and let alone did he manage to steady the ship he went onto a score a beautifully constructed 61. With the arrival of Charlie Sharp to the crease the run chase really started to take off with Charlie scoring a fiery 38. At this point the general feeling was that we were ahead but the game was ours to lose. Unfortunately with the loss of Tom and Charlie the game was just out of our reach. A thrilling and hard fought game, and a fitting way for the SPX 2nd XI team to end their season.

It has been such a positive experience for these fine young men and it has been rewarding to see them develop on an individual basis and as a team. The St Pius bowling effort started strongly. Economical and accurate bowling was a feature of the day. Special mention goes to Declan 2/4 off 4 overs, Darcy Keenlyside 1/4 off 3 overs and Cormac Molloy 1/7 off 4 overs. St Pius was in a very strong position after 23 overs, with Collaroy Plateau 4-57.

However, strong batting in the last 7 overs propelled our opponents at about a run a ball to have them finish on 7-100 at the end their 30 overs.
