Children growing in faith

We have just completed another busy year for the Catechist Classes.

On the 27th of November, the first Sunday of Advent, we had our first ever (and hopefully annual) Catechist Class Thanksgiving Mass which was attended by nine Catechist Class children and their families. The children were delighted to participate in the readings and the offertory procession, bringing up the gifts.

Catechist classes are for all those children who do not attend Catholic schools. We learn about our Catholic Faith and prepare to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Our Catechist Class year began on the third Tuesday in February with our Enrolment and Getting to Know You Day.



We soon started our Sacramental Programs for Eucharist and Confirmation while we learned about Lent (Ash Wednesday was week three), St Patrick, and St Joseph – six weeks in all for term one. Our Reconciliation Children were learning about Jesus, the Mass, the Sacraments, and the Church. Term two began with our celebration of Easter and the Feast of St Louis De Montfort, the Patron Saint of our Aspendale Church. In May, we got to know more about Our Lady, Mary the Mother of God. Our Sacramental Programs continued, and six children received their First Eucharist on the 12th of June with Fr Hoang at the 9.30 am Mass. (I think this was a first for Fr Hoang.)

In term three, we had only two more Confirmation lessons left before four of the children received their Confirmation at St Louis on the 26th of July. A definite highlight at the start of Term three for the children, was meeting Bishop Tony Ireland, who visited our parish on the Thursday morning prior to Confirmation. One child was away at school camp on Confirmation Day, but he was able to make his Confirmation in October with the children of St Joseph's Parish.

In August we celebrated the feast of St Mary of the Cross (Mackillop) and the Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven.

Our Reconciliation Program continued into term four and seven of our children made their First Reconciliation on the 18th of October. Parents and family members came along, and Fr Andrew and Fr Ignatius came to us at our normal class time, and we had a beautiful celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

One child was unable to attend, and she received her sacrament of Reconciliation with Fr Ignatius on the following Saturday before the 6pm Mass.

Our classes take place in the Foyer, Meeting Room, and Church at 4pm – 5pm on Tuesday afternoons during school terms.

Classes have now finished for this year, but we are looking forward to classes beginning again on the third Tuesday of February – 21st of February next year. *Elizabeth, Carmel, Jenny, and Gayle.*

A reflection from Fr Ignatius

Our parish warmly welcomes five candidates for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adult (RCIA) is a process of preparation for adults who wish to deepen their understanding of the Catholic faith. It is a journey of exploring our human existence, the meaning of life and our relationship with God. It is a journey of our own innermost searching, questioning and reflection. It is a journey of accompaniment with a group of sisters and brothers who facilitate and share with them their own Christian living experiences. It is also a journey of companionship with the congregation of the parish of St Mary of the Cross in sharing their faith and serving each other as sisters and brothers in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Who can be part of the RCIA process? This process is suitable for anyone who wants to know the Christian faith. Any non-Christians, free-thinkers, or anyone who has not been baptised; any Catholic who wants to deepen their knowledge and experience in faith, all are welcome to come and join in the enquire process when the RCIA process begins in August each year.

This is my very first exposure to the RCIA process in the parish. I had been through a traditional catechesis program delivered in classroom mode when I was a youth. This traditional mode did not give me much room to search deeper spiritually. I was too young to understand many realities in the universe. I was too young to fully understand the meaning of life. I went through the searching, questioning and development processes when I grew more mature in my life. I am still learning to understand God's will every day of my life.

This RCIA experience in St Mary of the Cross parish, allows the enquirers to search deep into the human existence through the resourceful video presentation offered by The Augustine Institute's FORMED, using the seven sessions of the "THE SEARCH" video series. The SEARCH allows us to reflect on our existence from the universe's perspective, and how it extends to our human existence. The "SEARCH" presentations have given me a visual impact of how big the universe is and how minute we human beings are. How Majestic God is, and how the Majestic God focuses on us, one of the minute creatures.

I feel in awe to have the honour to have God come down to search for us. There is certainly much thinking and questioning on why God wants to do all these things for us. Why did God send His only SON? All because of the love of God. God loves all. He creates, and everything is "Good" in God's eye, including each one of us.

The RCIA process is now going into the next stage in sharing and experiencing the Word of God, sharing the Sunday gospel reading. The scriptures will help us to understand the salvation history that is destined for us all. We can all explore through the liturgies of the Church and its sacraments to fully understand the love of God for us. This journey will later explore the Lent and Easter seasons allowing our candidates and catechumens to experience the love of God in Christ's passion and resurrection.

Care Serve Ministers to Residential Care

Bringing the love of Christ

There are many facets of **Care Serve Ministers** in our parish, and we are indeed very fortunate to have them.

I like to think of it as the 'Holy Spirit' working within our community which is the result of our hard-working Clergy, the Parish Leadership Team, Serve Ministers, and those of you who pray for the growth of the Spirit within our Parish.

To join our Residential Care, Serve Ministry one must be fully vaccinated (4 shots), had a flu shot, and a police check. In addition, one must be registered with the residence they attend, and each time - do a 'RAT test,' a temperature check, wear a mask, register, and sanitise.





These rules help to ensure the most vulnerable are protected. The four residential care homes that we attend have been colour coded to make it easier for rosters so that serve ministers do not attend another residence outside their colour zone.

Elly Kaye (Purple) - Parkdale House (Green) -Bayside (Blue) - Nixon House (Red).

Serve Ministers go in pairs. Some of the residents in these communities never see another visitor and they look forward to these special visitors bringing with them the "Body of Christ," and news of our Parish (weekly Bulletin). They come with their gentle, generous manner once a month.

A great opportunity for residents and staff, is the Anointings and Special Blessings in Lent and Advent. These are special times that include as many residents as possible who wish to attend regardless of their denomination. It is wonderful to see our bi-lingual volunteers speak with residents in their native tongue as many people in their remaining years revert to their first language. The staff are very obliging and helpful as they take the serve ministers to the rooms of those who are living out their lives bedridden or unable to attend functions outside their rooms

Continue to pray for the Serve Ministers in our community for their stamina, commitment, and generosity of spirit.





We also participated in the school's Tabloid Sports ably led by Miss Richards, the Sports leaders and some Year Five students. Blue House were the winners on the day with Yellow House winning the Spirit award.

The Year Four students experienced their first overnight camp, spending the night in the city. They explored some of the many sites our city has to offer including ACMI, the Shrine and the Queen Victoria Market.

This term each year level has focused on Earth and Space Science. They discovered that as a result of natural processes and human use of resources, the Earth is subject to change within and on its surface. They explored the ways in which humans use resources
