MATHEMATICS

Students will focus on developing their literal and inferential comprehension by reading a range of different texts. They will be given opportunities to make connections between texts and their own experiences and share these with their class. A focus on rereading and asking rich questions will assist students in their ability to summarise stories.

Students will enjoy participating in an author study focussed on Roald Dahl and his many literary works. Students will participate in small reading groups where they will complete a range of reflective

In Writing this term, we will be focusing on the genres of Narrative, Information Report and Personal Recount. Students will plan, draft, revise and publish a range of pieces, paying particular attention to the correct structure of each genre. Students will revise and focus on the correct use of punctuation in writing, and we will introduce the use of paragraphs in their writing.

Student will also regularly practise their handwriting, as well as their typing skills.

In Maths this term the students will explore the topics-

- Fractions
- Length
- Data
- Addition & Subtraction

Students will learn to recognise, model, and represent common fractions such as halves, thirds, quarters, and eighths using shapes and collections. As part of the measurement focus, students will use formal units (metres, centimetres and millimeters) to measure, compare, and order lengths accurately. The term will conclude with a focus on revising and extending their addition and subtraction skills.

Students will investigate the question

"How do maps show us the world, and what can they tell us about different places and climates?"

Students will learn about the major geographical divisions of the world, including the equator, tropics, poles, hemispheres, continents, and oceans. They will collect and record information from a variety of sources. To conclude the unit, students will present a mini project on a continent they have researched, sharing their knowledge with the class.

This term, our whole school value is 'Inclusion'. We will be exploring what it means to be inclusive and why it's important in our school and wider community. The students will learn to recognise and celebrate individual differences, and understand how inclusive behaviours help everyone feel valued and supported.

Students will begin the term with a focus on the events of Holy Week. We will then learn about Pentecost, and explore the relationship between God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

Students will explore the Holy Spirit in action in their families, their parish and in their wider community. Students will reflect on their understanding of the importance of using the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
