What have you learnt lots about? Shapes

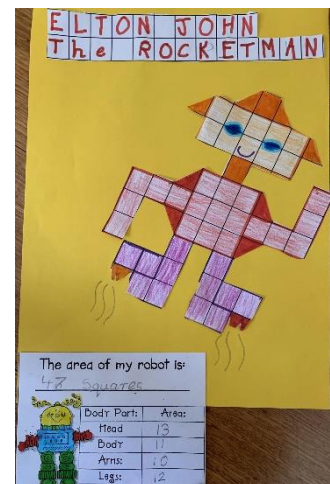
What are some of the differences about mathematics during remote learning and in the classroom?

Josh Year 2

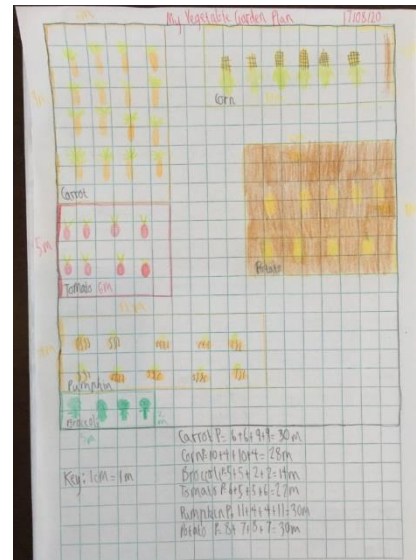
