Sunday, 5th April AD 33 - the First Easter?

This year, with Easter on 5 April, we happen to be celebrating on what is quite likely the very date of the Resurrection. We do not know the exact date or year of Jesus' death with certainty. However, the Gospels make clear that he died on a Friday which was either 14 Nisan or 15 Nisan (Passover) on the Jewish calendar.

In the time that Pontius Pilate was Governor of Judaea (AD 26-36), there are only two plausible dates for this: 7 April AD 30 or 3 April AD 33.

But only the latter date of AD 33 allows for the three Passovers minimum indicated by John's Gospel as occurring in Jesus' ministry, following 'the fifteenth year of [Roman Emperor] Tiberius Caesar' (late AD 28 - 29) (Lk 3:1), when according to Luke's gospel, John the Baptist began his ministry.

(This receives some further corroboration by an astronomical event occurring on Friday 3 April AD 33. That day, astronomical science tells us, there was a partial eclipse of the moon, visible as a 'blood moon' further east in the world, still in its final stages when the moon rose in Jerusalem at 6:20 pm. St Peter possibly refers to this at Pentecost (Acts 2:20) when he quotes the prophet Joel that the moon would turn to blood 'before the day of the Lord comes'.)

So the Resurrection of Jesus - being, as all the Gospels affirm, on the Sunday, 'the first day of the week', following his death on the Friday - was most likely **5 April AD 33**: exactly 1993 years ago, as we gather today.

In seven years, in 2033, the Church will celebrate the Jubilee of the 2000th anniversary of our Redemption.

2026 EASTER MESSAGE

Easter offers a way forward

Friends, Easter invites us to stand at the threshold from night into dawn. In the Gospel, we meet Mary Magdalen arriving at the tomb while it was still dark (Jn 20:1). She carries grief and confusion, yet a fragile hope. What she finds is not an ending but a beginning: the stone is rolled away, the tomb is empty. And before her stands the One who knows her name: Mary.

As dawn breaks, a quiet truth emerges: death has not had the final word; life has arisen.

The resurrection unfolds like morning light. It does not blind, but illumines. It does not erase wounds, but transfigures them. Christ, the Light of the World, comes to meet us as the light we need. Christ is present; Christ is life.

Yet many today experience absence. For the young especially, the world can feel stripped of mystery—flattened, reduced. Meaning feels distant; hope can seem lost. Our lives can appear dark and empty. Conflict and war confront us.

And yet, it is precisely there that Easter speaks our name. The empty tomb is the sign which awakens us to the truth that God is still with us; Jesus is still for us. This Easter, we are called not only to receive Christ's light, but to rediscover its wonder—and to bear that light for others.

Here in Melbourne, we see both vitality and vulnerability: generosity among neighbours, yet distance towards others. Into this world comes the risen Christ, shining light into every darkness and upon every life. To be a light is to reflect the One who brings hope, and to keep it alive in a world that can forget to hold in safety those in need.

In our divided and conflicted world, Easter offers not escape but a way forward: to live with compassion, seek truth, build peace, and stand for hope.

To the steadfast in faith: may this Easter renew your joy and courage. To those who feel distant: the light of Christ is already seeking you. To people of goodwill: Easter proclaims that life is stronger than death, love stronger than fear, and hope stronger than despair.

May the risen Christ bless Melbourne and all its people this Easter. And may we rediscover his company as we walk from darkness into his marvelous light.

Christ is risen. Alleluia.

(a) at the **Easter Vigil**: renew their baptismal vows; *or* receive First Communion (as will take place at Mentone on this occasion) *or* devoutly participate in that;

or (b) devoutly receive the **Pope's blessing 'Urbi et Orbi'**, even by (live) TV/internet (noon Rome time **Easter Sunday** - 8pm Melbourne time - accessible on the Vatican website, vatican.va).

Daylight saving ends tonight, Saturday 4th/Sunday 5th April.
Turn clocks back one hour.
