- As recognised by the Victorian Music Teachers' Association, the recommended <u>minimum cost</u> of instrumental music lessons at Auburn South Primary School is \$40.50 (ex.GST) per half hour individual lesson. <u>Your music</u> <u>teacher may set a higher fee in line with the **Instrumental Fee Cap*, and may specify an alternative per person rate for group instrumental lessons.
 </u>
- 2. Fees are calculated by the number of lessons in each term and are payable *IN ADVANCE* at the beginning of the term. Invoices will be distributed at the end of the previous term by instrumental music teachers, with the exception of Term 1. If fees are not paid by the due date, lessons will cease until payment has been made.
- 3. Fees are due on the date shown as the '*due date*' on each invoice. This *due date* will be your child's *first lesson* of the term (except in Term 1 when the due date will be on the second lesson).
- 4. Your instrumental teacher will determine their preferred method of payment. If you are paying by cheque, then please ensure these are made payable <u>directly to the teacher</u> (not the school). *If paying by cash, you must give this directly to the instrumental teacher*. <u>EFT is the safest and preferred method of payment</u>.
- 5. It is the parent's responsibility to notify the Instrumental Teacher (not the school) of any absence <u>5 business days prior to the scheduled lesson</u>. This includes absences due to school events such as, but not limited to, camps, excursions and curriculum/student free days. *Replacement lessons will not be arranged if 5 business days' notice of cancellation is not received.*

In the case of illness on the morning of the lesson day, a replacement lesson will be provided (limit of 4 per year) if the following conditions have been met:

- A phone call is made to the teacher *before 8:00am to notify that the student will not be at school* (where reasonably practicable)
- Fees for the current term have been paid by the due date

Please note that when students take personal leave to go on holidays, <u>2 weeks' notice</u> must be given to the teacher. Make up lessons can be negotiated at the teacher's discretion.

- 6. A replacement lesson will be arranged if the teacher is absent. In cases where this is not possible, the fee for that lesson will be deducted from the following term's invoice.
- 7. All students in the program will automatically continue lessons each term. Written notification is required to withdraw your child from the program and needs to be received 2 weeks prior to the end of the term, to avoid incurring the next term's fees.
- **8.** Students who are ill / at home for any reason *must not come to school* for their instrumental lessons. This is inappropriate under any circumstances due to legal and emergency management reasons.
- **9.** It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they bring their instrument and music etc. to each lesson. Students are encouraged to have their materials together in a folder such as a plastic document wallet.
- 10. All efforts will be made to ensure that students will not miss *Specialist* sessions and that weekly lessons will be scheduled on rotation (to ensure that students are not missing the same class each week) or as negotiated with the child's classroom teacher.
- **11.** Payment of fees implies acceptance of these conditions. Please keep a copy of the Terms and Conditions handy for your reference.

The Instrumental Fee Cap effects all <u>current</u> and <u>new enrolments</u> in the program. The Fee Cap will be indexed each year where appropriate.

The instrumental fee cap underpins the school's attitude towards fair and equitable access to instrumental music. The Fee Cap is in place for **one-on-one sessions** and **group sessions**.

ONE-ON-ONE SESSIONS (Yeung Ng – violin, Felix Thiang – guitar/Ukulele, Chris Dunn – woodwind, Jen Choo – piano & Lucia Liu – piano)

Students participating in one-on-one sessions will not be charged more than \$49 per ½ hour session (\$98 per 1 hour session) (exGST)

GROUP SESSIONS

Students participating in group sessions will not be charged more than \$105 per hour for the *whole group (exGST)

For example:

- Jack and Sasha group guitar lesson 2 students in a ½ hour session **\$26.25 maximum charge** per person per ½ hour session
- Jack, Sasha and Anika group guitar lesson 3 students in a ½ hour session \$17.50 maximum charge per person per ½ hour session
