Marrung Leads in NEVR Schools

'Marrung' is the Department of Education (DE) Aboriginal Education Plan to ensure that all Indigenous Victorians achieve their learning aspirations. The Marrung Education Plan is aimed at improving performance and success of Koorie students in Victoria and close the gap in their educational outcomes.

The introduction of the Marrung Lead commitment assists to support better Koorie student and family engagement and learning through strong advocacy for a whole of school approach utilising the Individual Education Plan (IEP) as the fundamental key platform to improve learning and engagement.

The 'Term 1 Outer East Marrung Lead Collaboration and Capability Day' with our Marrung Area Implementation Team and Koorie Education Workforce was held on Monday 18th March and was positively attended by many schools within the area.

Collaborative Indigenous Strategy

Yarra Ranges Tech School (YRTS) Koorie Student Program

The Lilydale District and Yarra Valley Education Plan's Yarra Ranges Tech School Program once again has kicked off with an AMAZING start. This program involves students from Mooroolbark College, Upper Yarra Secondary College, Lilydale High School, Lilydale Heights College, Healesville High School, Yarra Hills Secondary College and Bayswater Secondary College.



The Tech School program provides an opportunity for the Koorie students that attend the six schools as part of the Education Plan to come to the YRTS on five occasions to work on their design and project.

They develop an idea that is of interest to them and use the Design Thinking Process to find a solution to their problem. This involves developing their idea, finding solutions to the problem, and then testing and prototyping on the array of technology available at the Tech School.

Day 1 to 3 were a huge success with presentations from Zach Prior (Deadly Science), Jade Haar, Cameron Briscoe and Winston Lewinsmith (National Australia Bank).





2024 Formula 1 Grand Prix Experience

On Thursday the 21st and Friday 22nd March, several students from the Lilydale District and Yarra Valley Education Plan had the deadly opportunity to participate in an exciting extra-curricular experience attending the 2024 Formula 1 Grand Prix at Albert Park.















In collaboration with Deadly Science, the Australian Grand Prix Corporation crafted a unique experience that highlighted the innovation in Formula 1 whilst simultaneously enriching students' understanding of what goes on behind the scenes at one of the world's major sporting events and showcasing the pathway opportunities available through the Grand Prix.

Across the day students were able to participate in a full day of interactive workshops with Frist Nations scientists and joined in a sit-down interview with both the Red Bull Team drivers, Max Verstappen and Sergio Perez and the Williams Team drivers, Logan Sargeant and Alexander Albon. They also had a guided tour of the Supercar Pits and spoke with mechanics from the Shell V-Power Racing Team about the previous days' race.

DeadlyScience wants to ensure all schools have access to our history of science by providing resources that connect schools to the First Scientists of Australia, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Their aim is to provide science books and early reading material to remote schools in Australia. They have shipped over 25,000 books, 700 telescopes, 10,000 Lego kits and other STEM resources over 180 communities, with more to come.

A big shout out and thanks goes to the team at DeadlyScience for providing this fantastic opportunity for our Koorie students.
