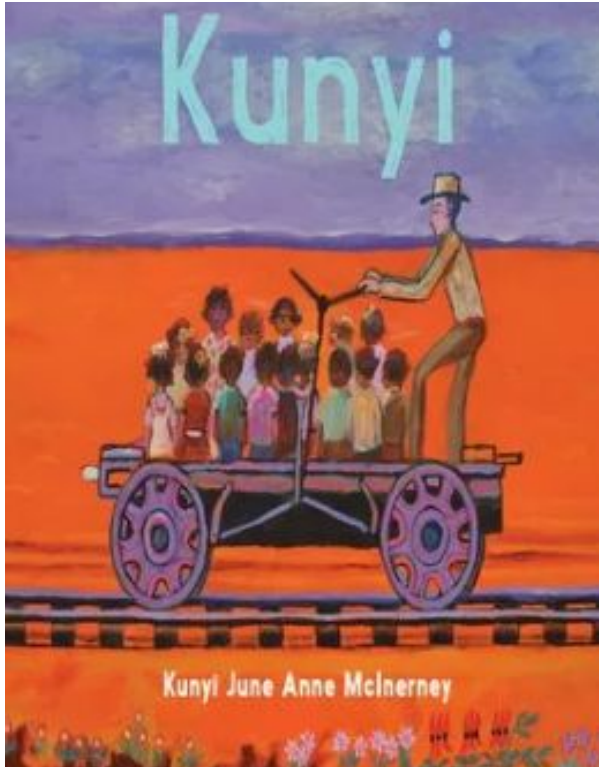

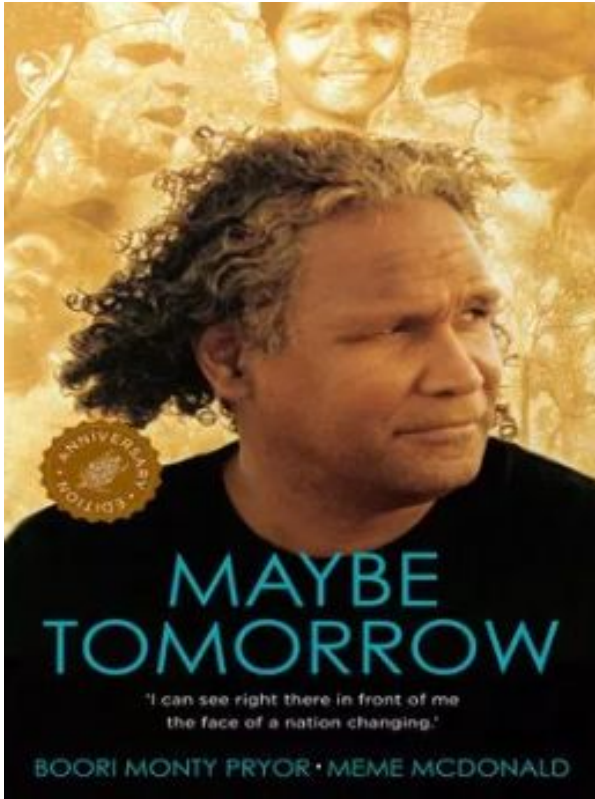

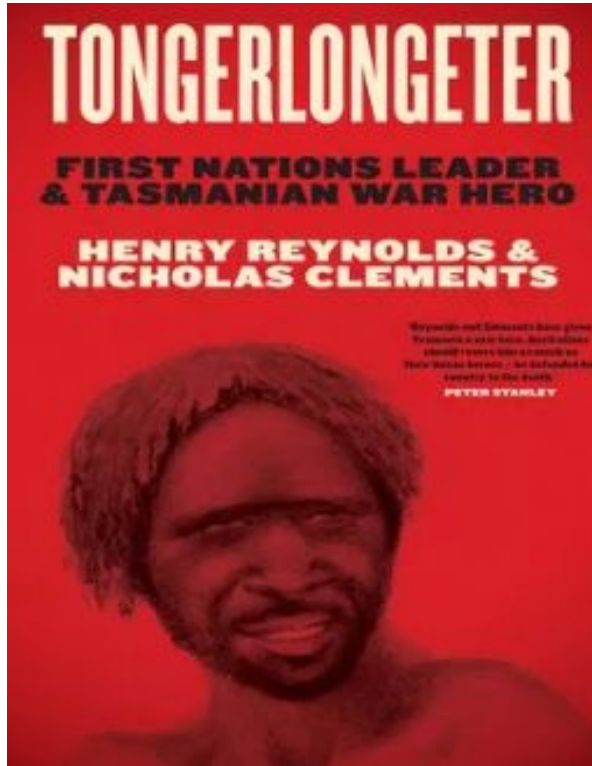

During Tasmania’s gruesome Black War of 1823–31, Tongerlongeter led the most effective Aboriginal resistance campaign in Australian history. Hi Oyster Bay Nation of southeast Tasmania and his ally MontPELLIATTA’S Big River Nation of central Tasmania embarked on 710 attacks, killing 182 colonists and wounding a further 176. First Nations casualties were up to three times greater and their population plummeted. Militarily it was a lost cause, yet these Aboriginal warriors’ determined resistance and dogged commitment to Country, culture and each other provoked desperation at every level of the fledgling colony.
