Liturgical JottingsNight Prayer (Compline)

Compline also known as Night Prayer, or the Prayers at the End of the Day, is the final prayer liturgy (or divine office) of the day in the Christian tradition of canonical hours, which are prayed at fixed prayer times. The English word is from the Latin completorium, as compline is the completion of the waking day. Compline is a part of Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and Eastern Orthodox, and certain other Christian traditions. It tends to be a contemplative office emphasises spiritual peace. In most monasteries it is the custom to begin the "Great Silence" after compline, during which the whole community, including observes silence until first prayer in the morning.

It comprises of an "Examen" of the day hymn, one or two psalms, a reading, response, the canticle of Simeon: "Nunc Dimittis" (Luke 2:29-32) concluding prayer and an anthem to Mary.

Looking at the Readings

Theophany is not a word we use often, yet today we have the witness of two theophanies: God manifesting himself to humans. First to Elijah on Mt Horeb in the sound of silence and them to the apostles when Jesus calmed the sea and the wind. Only God has that power. We read: "they bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'" (14:33) The parallel passage in Mark portrays great emotions not found in Matthew: they were terrified by the storm and utterly and completely dumbfounded by the miracle. (Mark 6:49,51). Elijah was much encouraged to now continue his mission, the apostle were beginning to recognise Christ.

Several times in the Gospel we hear Peter wanted to follow the Lord. He has great eagerness and faith but also has fears and misunderstandings. So many times Peter expresses out aloud what the others are thinking to themselves. Each Christian wants to affirm their faith, increase their trust and understanding so as to follow Jesus more closely. We rejoice in the epiphanies and theophanies moments, even when they are not as often as we would like.

Did You Know?

Hills and mountains are often referred to where Jesus goes to pray. He prays alone or in accompany with a few. Interestingly there are no hills near the Lake of Galilee, Matthew's reference that Jesus went up into the hills has a metaphoric meaning rather than a geographic reality. It most likely indicates a time of quiet solitude and prayerfulness.

Prayer for the Day

God of all power, your sovereign word comes to us in Christ. When your Church is in danger, make firm our trust; when your people falter, steady our faith. Show us in Jesus your power to save, that we may always acclaim him as Lord, who lives and reigns God for ever and ever. Amen.

REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

It's interesting how doubts often confront us, unwanted maybe? The encounter of Jesus with Peter has a situation of doubt. It's as if we can take Peter at his word... 'Can I really do this?' suggesting a walking on water feat might put him onto a level with Jesus. Humanely, we know doubts can paralyse, hold us back, even leading us away from a presence of the Lord. A key here is to call out from our hearts... 'Lord, please hear me!'.

The encouragement we gain from this gospel story, is at times in the smallness of faith a greater calling can open us to move from doubt. It is to the Church, to individuals, and communities of disciples in the littleness of faith, the hands of Jesus reach out calling us to come! It just might be we find ourselves being the 'water walkers!' in this time of being the living Church we tread with great hope, we tread with a purpose of seeing outside of ourselves to the nature of community binding us in our being in a communion of faith.

Sunday after Sunday we come in our gathering to bring praise for God's workings sometimes to hear the miraculous of story causing us to see our place in the event. It might be to bring the personal 'storms' we have from the week. Maybe it's this week ahead we find a comfort to ponder the works of God within us.

From a different angle... This Tuesday recalls for us the Assumption of Mary into the realm of heavenly glory... her resurrection! Mary embodies humility and lowliness. Mary's life affirms God's promise, where the lowly of our time and place are found in God's life giving and affirming presence.



First Reading A reading from the prophet Isaiah
