Focus on the Readings

Throughout this liturgical year we have examined several aspects of our faith. We have pondered the history of our salvation, the merciful compassion of God, God's willingness to lead us out of the bondage of our addictions. We have meditated often and long on the person of Jesus, on his life and death, on the meaning of his sacrifice, on his resurrection, on his influence in our lives today. We have considered our own ongoing transformation as disciples of Jesus, baptised into his death and resurrection, commissioned to bring the news of his love to all those with whom we come into contact. We have reflected on all of these wonderful deeds of God, and now we must ask the question: What difference has it made?

Have we merely acquired some information about the biblical readings, about our religious ancestors, about the ministry of Jesus and the life of the early church? Or have our eyes really been opened; have we been enabled to leave behind whatever prevents us from living the Christian life fully, to abandon our exiles or the trappings of our former lives? Have we accepted more genuinely the Christian responsibilities that are ours as baptised followers of Christ, in our own personal lives, in our families, in our relationships with others, at the workplace? To what degree have we been transformed into Christ? How open have we become to the action of the Spirit in our lives? Have we been made a new creation? Liturgical Jottings Inculturation III

The Liturgy must be capable of expressing itself in every human culture, all the while maintaining its identity through fidelity to the tradition which comes to it from the Lord. Varietates Legitimae n. 18 While the process of inculturation and adaptation of the liturgy in the local Church some caution is expressed in the 2010 General Instruction of the Roman Missal:

"Inculturation requires a necessary length of time, lest the authentic liturgical tradition suffer hasty and incautious contamination. The pursuit of inculturation does not have as its purpose in any way the creation of new families of rites but aims rather at meeting the needs of a particular culture, though in such a way, that adaptations introduced either into the Missal or coordinated with other liturgical books are not at variance with the proper character of the Roman Rite. GIRM 398-399.

Weekly Reflection

Reflection on Creation and Human Sexuality

The Book of Genesis presents two distinct accounts of creation, each offering a unique perspective on the divine act. The familiar first account unfolds over six days, portraying a structured creation process. In contrast, the second account, which we explore today, presents a more intimate view—a close-up that sheds light on human sexuality and our inherent dignity. This account emphasizes the profound truth that "God created man in his own image and likeness; male and female he created them," underscoring the beauty of our differences and the unity intended by our Creator.

In reflecting on this second account, it becomes clear that our understanding of sexuality is integral to our human experience. As we delve deeper, we realize the significant impact of original sin, which disrupted the harmonious relationship between the sexes. This disruption remains prevalent in our world today, leading to confusion and pain. It is essential to recognize that this isn't merely a historical account; it speaks directly to the challenges we face in contemporary society.

Jesus' teachings in the Gospels reaffirm these truths about human sexuality. By addressing the Pharisees, He emphasizes God's original design, reminding us of the importance of upholding these values in a world that often undermines them. In an age where cultural narratives frequently clash with Christian perspectives, we are called to embody and share these essential truths—to preserve the sanctity of our relationships and to be instruments of God's message.

In our commitment to understanding and living out God's design for human sexuality, we must first cultivate this understanding within ourselves. This personal journey will equip us to support those around us, especially individuals who may not grasp the beauty of God's plan. As we navigate life's complexities, may we strive to reflect the love and wisdom inherent in our creation, becoming beacons of hope and clarity in a world that desperately needs it. Through this reflection, we can embrace our identity and its divine purpose, fostering a deeper connection with ourselves and others.


