2. Which word do you think seems more negative? Why?

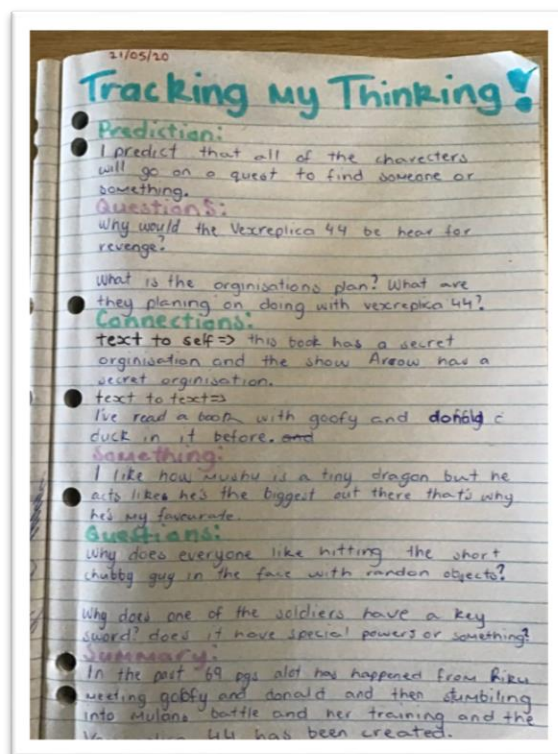
