[5 things you need to know about EAS](#)



The Educational Access Scheme (EAS) helps UAC applicants who have encountered significant educational challenges. It gives them the opportunity to have their circumstances taken into account when institutions select applicants for courses.

If you are a current Year 12 student applying for EAS, you'll need to submit your application and documents by 19 November 2026 for the application to be considered for December Round 2 (23 December 2026), the main ATAR-based offer round.

The Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) is one way Year 12 students can receive an early offer to university. Through SRS, universities can make offers to students based on criteria other than the ATAR, including their Year 11 results and their school's recommendation.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Pathway Entry Program is an alternative University Entry Program for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Applicants can gain entry to any undergraduate degree* at Western Sydney University by completing our entry assessment and be supported throughout your education journey.

To gain entry to your dream degree, you are required to complete an Entry Assessment. The entry assessment includes a short essay and comprehension task. If your preferred degree requires numeracy, you will also be required to complete a short numeracy assessment. We provide you with access to online resources and practice tests, to help you get prepared.

The degrees available under the admissions scheme are:

- Bachelor of Music
- Bachelor of Music (Composition)
- Bachelor of Music (Performance)

If you are a current HSC student in NSW, you must do the following:

- Apply to UAC by the audition registration closing date.
- List your chosen music degree as your first preference - one of the applicable degrees listed above.
- Apply directly to the Conservatorium for an audition/portfolio submission for a July or September audition.

The round you select for your audition/interview has no bearing on your CASAS eligibility, nor how you will be assessed. However, the advantage of choosing the July round is that you will have completed the process well before the HSC is underway.

For most NSW Year 12 HSC students, no separate application is required, and your Year 11 and 12 results and predicted ATAR will be obtained automatically through UAC by the Sydney College of the Arts.

You will be assessed on your portfolio, plus your academic results from years 11 and 12 so far. Predicted ATAR scores will be obtained by Sydney College of the Arts through UAC for students sitting the HSC or must be submitted directly if you are an interstate applicant.

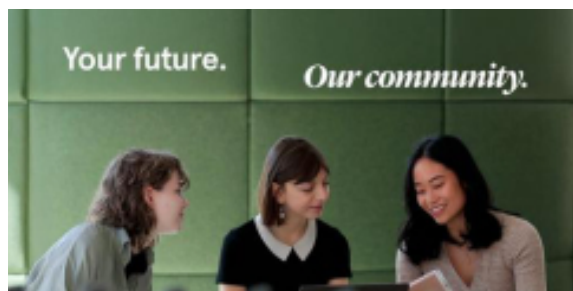

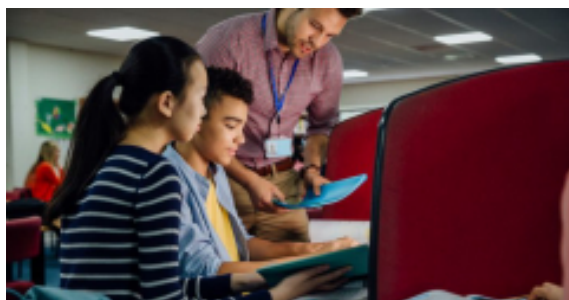

NIDA is committed to building a diverse community of students and strongly encourages applications from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, people who are Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) and people with a disability.

Eligible students entering their first, second or third year in a full-time Higher Education course (Bachelor or Master of Fine Arts degrees) are able to apply for a scholarship at the beginning of the academic year.

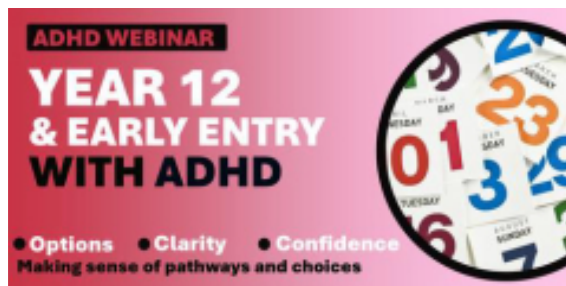
