All our presenters both challenged and inspired us.

There was also time throughout the Pilgrimage for both conversation and fun - a very competitive trivia evening, a walk to Lygon Street for ice-cream and more.

The Pilgrimage concluded on Day 3 with a very meaningful mass where pilgrims were commissioned to go forth with hope and joy.
