**Surfside Primary is a non-profit organisation.** All of the monies received and/or raised by the school are used to finance learning programs and to maintain and develop our school buildings and grounds. The difference between funds provided by the Department of Education and Training through our Student Resource Package and those required for this school to operate to the high standard that we expect, leaves a shortfall which our School Council attempts to raise through School Council Voluntary Contributions and other local activities (eg. interest, fundraising, commissions etc.)

### Refunds

Refunds will only be considered when requesting in writing within 21 days of the excursion taking place or the commencement of the camp.

Where Surfside Primary School makes the decision to cancel a camp or excursion, the amount paid by the student shall be refunded in full.

Where a camp or excursion has to be rescheduled because of Government or Department of Education warnings e.g fire or weather danger etc parents may request a refund of monies paid by them less any funds incurred by the school for the rescheduled trip.

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
