SAFETRAC ONLINE TRAINING FOR PARISH STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS: As part of the Diocesan Safeguarding Policy released late last year, parish staff and volunteers are required to undertake Safeguarding training regularly. The Diocese has released an online training module called Safeguarding Children in the Diocese of Sale. Staff and volunteers in our parish who have an email address will shortly receive an email link to complete the training. This training is completed every three years. Other arrangements are being made for volunteers who do not have emails or internet access. We ask for your cooperation to undertake this online training as soon as possible as part of our parish commitment to promoting a safe environment for our children, youth, and adults at risk.

**SAFEGUARDING VULNERABLE ADULTS** Vulnerable adults are defined as people who are unable to protect themselves against harm or exploitation for any reason. Safeguarding adults involves reducing and preventing the risk of harm, neglect, or abuse. Most would consider vulnerable adults to be those who lack capacity. However, adults with full capacity can also be considered vulnerable in certain situations such as a drastic change in the financial situation, personal tragedy, natural calamity.

To safeguard vulnerable adults, one must: -

- Ensure the person can live in safety, away from abuse and neglect.
- Encourage the person to make his/her own choices to provide informed consent.
- Prevent risk of abuse or neglect and to stop it from happening.
- Promote the well-being of the person by taking their thoughts, feelings, wishes and beliefs into account.

**SAFEGUARDING:** All parish volunteers are reminded that you are required to comply with the diocesan and parish policy as follows:

- 1. To have a valid Working With Children Check certificate from the Department of Justice;
- 2.To sign the current parish Code of Conduct every 3 years; and
- 3.To undergo the diocesan Safeguarding Training annually (either on-line or in person whenever it is available).
- Should you have any difficulty in complying with any of the above requirements, kindly inform the parish office and we will assist you to do the necessary.

# **MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION**

Save us Saviour ... ...

#### Reflection:

Belief in the Trinity is a central mystery of Christian faith. We are baptized 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' (Matt. 28:19), and we are invited to develop a relationship with each Person of the Blessed Trinity. Jesus' life, work, ministry, preaching and teaching all testify to this fundamental truth of Christian revelation.

In fact, the doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity could be described as the central mystery of the Christian faith and life, and it is this mystery that we are celebrating and rejoicing in today, Trinity Sunday.

For many Christians, the 'mystery' of the Trinity remains just that: a mystery. But the word in this sense is not used to mean a conundrum, puzzle or riddle that is impossible to solve, but a holy and sacred truth which we will only be able to penetrate more deeply if we ask the Holy Spirit to shed his light and truth into our minds and spirits. Instead of saying, 'I can't get my head around the Trinity', we need to say, I need God's help to get my head into the Trinity.' In other words, we need to pray, 'Lord, teach me, show me, guide me, lead me into the beauty, glory and majesty of the mystery of your Blessed Trinity.'

Try praying the following prayer today.

'0 my God, Trinity whom I adore, help me to forget myself entirely so as to establish myself in you, immovable and peaceful as if my soul were already in eternity'

(Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity)
