RE/INQUIRY

In Term 4 our Reading focus is on comparing and contrasting. We will look at two versions of the same story and investigate the similarities and differences. In writing we will explore and consolidate a range of text types, including recounts, poetry and narratives.

Students will be combining design and technology to complete a fun and engaging writing project when they return to on-site schooling.

We strongly encourage students continue their excellent reading habits - reading a book of their choice for at least 15-20 minutes per night.

In Term 4 we will be exploring the following topics - Location, Mass, and division, as well as consolidating and extending our learning of fractions and the four operations.

Some students have been practising their times tables as part of remote learning and we strongly encourage this as part of your nightly routine. Knowledge of times tables allows students to quickly compute numbers and is highly advantageous as they prepare for Year 3 in 2022.

As with any learning, please allow your child to work at their own pace!

Hope is our overarching theme for our Religion and Inquiry learning in Term 4. Our essential question is, 'How can we share our hope with others?'

We will reflect on our hopes and investigate some other communities that may have very different hopes to ours. Student will collaboratively design a way to help and support those who have more needs than us. They will explore ways to take action and make a difference to somebody

Our theme of Hope then weaves it way into the season of Advent, when we prepare in hope for the coming of Jesus.
