Thinking of a career in Cyber Security?

If you're thinking of a future career in Cyber Security, you'll be glad to hear that:

Cyber Security is a growing industry

- According to Job Outlook future growth in this industry is **very strong**, a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 9.7% from 2021 to 2026 (Source: Researchandmarkets.com) globally
- There were 50,500 Database & Systems Administrators & ICT Security in 2020 in Australia and this expected to reach 60,500 by 2025
- Australia is currently short of 2300 workers in cyber security, with an **expected demand of at least 17,600 additional professionals** in the sector by 2026. (Source: institutedata.com)
- The Worldwide Cybersecurity Industry is Expected to Reach \$345.4 Billion by 2026 (Source: Researchandmarkets.com)
- In 2020 Australian spent approximately \$5.6 billion on cyber security, expected to increase to \$7.6 billion by 2024. (Source: Austercyber.com)
- Eight in ten Australians access the internet daily and 79% use social media all putting valuable information online which can be stolen or exploited posing risks to our privacy, safety, economy and potentially our national security. (Sources: sensis.com.au and industry.gov.au)

Work Life Balance

Role in this industry can be [rewarding](#) with:

- High salaries and lots of opportunities
- Being a high-demand job
- High career progression
- The opportunity to be self-employed
- Chance to work remotely anywhere in the world
- You're always learning

The downsides to consider could include:

- High-stress and demanding hours
- Companies lack knowledge and/or resources
- Some repetitive or boring tasks
- Less room for mistakes
- Difficulty keeping up with fast-paced trends and emerging new information

How to get into Cyber Security

There are lots of pathways into a career in Cyber Security – training and qualification are often required.

Lots of universities offer [undergraduate degrees](#), [postgraduate degrees](#) and all kinds of other qualifications in Cyber Security. Have a look at all of your [VET](#) options and [other courses](#) that are available, decide which could be the right path for you.

Build on your technical aptitude (yes you'll definitely need to be tech savvy for roles in this industry) [skills](#), including knowledge of security across various platforms. A foundation knowledge in computer forensics could be beneficial too, and you'll need to learn some "ethical hacking" skills so that you can understand how a system could be breached, and in turn, create effective solutions for thwarting these attacks.

Alternatives to Work Experience

Finding work experience in this industry could be tricky for a number of reasons from the fact that workers are busy, their work is sensitive, and they often work remotely. So what can you do instead?

Our first piece of advice would be to worry a little bit less. It's incredibly difficult to source qualified devs and cyber security experts because they are so in demand – in fact some companies are offering bonuses to uni grads to sign on straight away.

The next piece of advice would be to do two things:

1. Start a blog or channel on medium, and build your thought leadership in your space. If you don't already have a LinkedIn profile then set one up, and connect with your teachers and people in your industry who you may want to work with. Write about the things that matter to your industry, and don't worry about getting everything 'perfect', just get yourself out there. Networks will help you get a job.
2. Start working on your own tech. Build sites, even if they're just for your friends' businesses, and play around with what you can create. Set yourself projects and give yourself work experience. You may find that other professionals in your industry are happier to help you out if they know you're working on a 'project', and sometimes one or two conversations with the right people can be more powerful than a week of work experience.

Our last tip would be to make sure you're working on your core skills, as well as your technical skills. An understanding of business, design, and people will put you ahead of lots of the competition and make you an asset to any organisation.

You could focus on:

- Communication
- Adaptability
- Interpersonal skills
- Problem solving
- Critical thinking
- Attention to detail
- Self-motivation

Where the jobs are

There are lots of industries you can work in, but not all of them are the same size.

The largest industry in Australia is Health Care and Social Assistance, which is expected to employ over 2 million people by November 2025. In contrast, the smallest industry (electricity, gas, water, and waste) will employ around 164,000 people at the end of 2025.

The size of an industry does not correlate directly with your chances of getting a job, so if you've got your heart set on one of the smaller industries completely ignore this article. If, however, you're more concerned about increasing your chances of finding a job, then you may want to know where the jobs are most likely to be.

We know some jobs are growing faster than others *within* each industry – for example, the Accommodation and Food Services sector is growing, but most of the jobs are as waiters and store or restaurant managers, while the number of workers who sell tickets or maintain vending machines is in decline.

Letz Live have been helping young Aussies get overseas on a Gap Year since 2005.

With opportunities in the UK, New Zealand and Thailand these programmes are a great way to live, work and travel overseas. You'll be connected with a group of other participants when you arrive so you can immediately make new friends to share the experience with.

Working as Boarding Assistant

Tim from Canberra is currently on his Gap Year in New Zealand. He tells us what a standard day is like.

"When I'm not on duty in the boarding house, I wake up at 7:30am. I head over to the school dining hall where I'll have a cooked breakfast waiting for me. I then get a text from the timetable organiser. This tells me which classes I will be supporting for the day. Sometimes I can have every period of the day and other days I'll have a day off. When this happens I take students to appointments or help with teacher errands.

However, when I am on duty it's very different. Wake up is at 6am, I need to go downstairs and wake up the Year 9s at 6:30am. I make sure they're awake and ready to go to breakfast, then wake up the year 10s at 6:45am. This goes all the way till the year 13s at 7:30am. Then the normal relief teaching goes on where I am told what classes I need to help out with and where."

Travelling during the school breaks

One of the best parts of a Gap Year is being able to explore and travel on the weekends or school holidays.

Alice, currently on her Gap Year in the UK, has spent part of the summer on a horse-riding trip in Spain. She says...

"A big part of my decision to take a gap year in the UK was the excitement of Europe being so close for our summer holiday. Myself and a fellow gap both love that our school offers riding for the girls and ourselves in our off time we are able to go out on the horses too. This prompted us to research ways we could ride during our two month break while we were away, we then landed on a riding holiday at Los Alamos in Spain. The week-long stay was one of the best choices we had made short of taking a gap year.

During this week we got the opportunity to ride through the gorgeous national park and down for gallops along the beaches of Cape Trafalgar and El Palmar.

The entire week was paradise and felt like home away from home. I have never enjoyed every aspect of a holiday more, the food, the locals, the views and environment as well as the activities. forever grateful for the opportunity to not only go to Spain but on a riding holiday in Spain, which would have been much more difficult if it weren't for taking a gap year as being such a short flight away only made it better."

What do Logistics Managers do?

Logistics Managers are responsible for making sure our goods and resources travel smoothly from the supplier to the customer. They oversee the organisation, storage, distribution and transport of goods in order to keep costs down and operations running efficiently.

If you are a problem-solving expert, have excellent time management skills, and can think quickly on your feet, this could be an ideal career for you.

The job:

- Monitoring the purchasing, storage and supply of goods and materials

- Liaising with suppliers, staff and customers to ensure smooth processing of items

This is a large occupation, with around 24,500 people working as Logistics Managers in 2020 (source: joboutlook.gov.au), with strong growth expected over the next five years. Demand for Logistics Managers is highest in New South Wales and Victoria. Most Logistics Managers work in the Transport, Postal and Warehousing, and Manufacturing industries.

Your role as a Logistics Manager might vary depending on the type of goods and materials you are in charge of managing. For example, perishable goods such as food and drink require specialised storage and much stricter deadlines than things like clothing, etc.

How to become a Logistics Manager in Australia

Although formal qualifications aren't a strict requirement, they can greatly boost your skills and employability, and you'll likely need extensive work experience without one.

Step 1 – If you're in Year 9 or 10, try and find work experience in the warehousing or transport industry.

Step 2 – Complete Year 12 with a strong focus on English and Maths.

Step 3 – Consider starting with a VET qualification such as a [Diploma of Logistics](#). This can give you access to entry-level logistics jobs where you can start building your experience.

Step 4 – Build on your management skills with an undergraduate degree, such as a Bachelor of Business majoring in [Logistics and Supply Chain Management](#).

Step 5 – Explore your possibilities working with all kinds of goods, including food and drink, machinery, clothing, raw materials, and more.

What are 3 things I can do right now to help me become a Logistics Manager?

If you're in high school and you'd like to find out if a career as a Logistics Manager is right for you, here's a few things you could do right now:

1. Get work experience in warehousing or transport. This is a great way to get experience in the industry and find out if this might be the right job for you.
2. Volunteer in your school or community to start building essential skills, such as communication, organisation and problem solving. These skills look great on your resume for any job.
3. See if you can talk to someone who works in logistics or supply chain management to get an idea of what a day in their life is like.
