The final one for 2025 was at Curtin on 5 May.

Curtin Career Teachers' Information Day Trends



In 2025 over 50% of West Australian school leavers choose Curtin as their first university preference Curtin now has over 60,000 students. It has campuses in Bentley, as well as in the city, and in Kalgoorlie.



Curtin University Bentley Campus

The Kalgoorlie campus is the traditional home of skills development for the mining and resources industries. It opened at the peak of the gold rush in 1902 and is now a world leader in earth sciences, and mining and mineral engineering.



Curtin also has campuses in Dubai, Malaysia, Singapore, and Mauritius.

Non ATAR Pathways


Curtin encourages school students to apply directly through TISC. 91% of school leavers **who apply through TISC** use their ATAR score and 9% use alternatives like UniReady or portfolio entry.

- Over 70% of WA students leave Year 12 without an ATAR score.
- 30% of school leavers enter university through non-ATAR pathways.
- Academic Status of Undergraduates WHO APPLIED THROUGH TISC showed:
 - \circ $\;$ ATAR Students with 82% good standing and 1% terminated their studies.
 - UniReady students had 94% good standing OR CONDITIONAL STATUS leaving 6% who terminated their studies.






• General English with a "B" Grade, will meet Curtin's English Competency requirement.

- There are many ways of meeting the English Competency requirement I have checked and there is a significant variety of eligible tests.
- **Early applications open on 3 June** through TISC based on predicted ATARs in Year 11. Offers for 2026 will not be made until 1 September.
- TISC Applications close on 30 September for most courses.
- If you want to defer an early offer, wait for confirmation that you have been given a place, then defer.
- Early offers are **not** available for:
 - UniReady
 - Competitive courses
 - Portfolio entry

Portfolio Entry



If you would like to be considered for portfolio entry, please **tick that box on the TISC application form**, even if you are applying via ATAR.

We were told that 29 November is the final date to get portfolio applications in – so you don't HAVE to attach your portfolio to your TISC application.

Portfolio entry requires:

- WACE
- B in General English, Literature or English as an Additional language or Dialect
- Demonstrated academic preparedness.
- Satisfaction of any course prerequisites.

Applying via a portfolio submission is a lot of work as you need to demonstrate in a variety of ways that you have a fair chance of succeeding at uni. Your career or student services teachers may be able to help you to prepare your application.

Health Sciences

Professor Marina Ciccarelli- Dean of Learning & Teaching



Course Switching

Professor Ciccarelli spent some time explaining that students who fail to gain a place in their first course choice, can course switch in their second year if they meet the prerequisites.

An excellent Grade Point Average in the first year of Exercise and Sport Sciences for example, which has an entry ATAR of 70, could be a pathway into Physiotherapy, which has an entry ATAR of 90.

This would be very difficult to achieve, but it is possible.

Nursing (ATAR 70)

The <u>Bachelor of Science (Advanced Nursing)</u> is replacing the Bachelor of Nursing at Curtin.

There are no prerequisites, but ATAR Human Biology is desirable.

The course includes 840 hours of unpaid work placement over the 3 years of the course.

Midwifery (ATAR 80)

The <u>Bachelor of Science (Midwifery)</u> is a 3 year course with Human Biology and Maths Applications as being desirable entry subjects.

The course has 1250 hours of unpaid work experience (Placements and Continuity of Care Experience) as part of the course requirements.

Paramedicine (ATAR 75)

<u>The Bachelor of Science (Paramedicine)</u> has Human Biology and Integrated Sciences as desirable entry requirements.

The course includes 550 hours of work placement over the 3 years.

Diploma of Sport

The Diploma of Sport has an equivalent ATAR of 84 and is therefore a pathway to Exercise and Sport Science,

Science and Engineering


The Science and Engineering Faculty identified that students who undertake the traditional ATAR math's pathway have a higher weighted average than those who don't.

Maths while in Year 11 and 12

Still the best environment to learn mathematical concepts – Small classes, classroom teacher support, length of learning (2 years vs 12 weeks) etc.

On average, students who undertake the traditional ATAR math's pathway into our courses have a higher course weighted average than their pathway peers.

Please encourage and counsel students to take a maths course that suits their ability at the time.



Engineering (ATAR 80)

The <u>Bachelor of Engineering (Hons)</u> is a 4 year full time course with Maths Methods and either Chemistry or Physics as prerequisites. The first year is a common foundation year and students can specialise from their second year.

There are <u>11 specialisations</u> with the new energy and software majors about to be launched.

Computing

There will be three potential specialisations in computing:

- \Rightarrow Cyber security
- \Rightarrow Computer science
- \Rightarrow Software engineering.

Business and Law

Curtin is the largest Business school in WA. It is ranked first in Western Australia by the Eduniversal Palmes of Excellence which ranks business schools around the world. Curtin Business School is also recognized as an elite global business school in Australia through various accreditations.



Bachelor of Business (ATAR 75)

The <u>Bachelor of Business</u> is a 3 year degree.

Bachelor of Law (ATAR 90)

Curtin Law School is the #1 Law School in Western Australia.

The <u>Bachelor of Law</u> is a 3 year degree. This is a foundation degree which gives sound legal advice. You can choose from optional units that focus on topics such as forensic advocacy, employment law, environmental law and policy, law and technology human rights law and native title law and policy.

You will need to do an additional <u>Graduate Diploma</u> in order to practice law.

Bachelor of Innovation (ATAR 70)

Students enrolling in the <u>Bachelor of Innovation</u> can select units from across science or humanities.

Geophysicists combine geology and physics to locate resources. They also study the internal structure and evolution of the earth and the ocean to predict earthquakes, erosion and volcanoes.

Many SEG members play a role in understanding climate change and in managing CO₂ emissions, including observing glacier and ice sheet volume, studying glacier hydrology, evaluating permafrost degradation, and evaluating and monitoring reservoirs for CO₂ sequestration.

Get Your Unique Student Identifier (USI)

All students undertaking nationally recognised training, like a VET in Schools course, or First Aid training, must have a USI. Without a USI, they won't receive their statement or attainment, qualification, or award upon completion of their studies.

You also need your USI to be able to access Commonwealth Government Supported Places at university. The Commonwealth Supported Places are subsidised university places available to all Australians.

<u>Create your USI.</u> The process is simple and can be completed in less than five minutes using a form of <u>identification</u>, such as a birth certificate.

Student Debt – Gen Z Humanities Students Getting a Raw Deal from Universities

Under the Job-Ready Graduates Package many humanities students contribute up to 93%

in course costs. For some STEM subjects, student contributions can be as low as 13% of course fees.

School students show a relaxed attitude towards the spiralling costs of university education as they choose their university pathways. The debt they accumulate by doing their degree impacts for years past their graduation.

The cost of undergraduate degrees has been increasing since the introduction of the <u>Job-Ready Graduate Package</u>

by the Morrison government, which Professor Mike Dockery from Bankwest Curtin Economics Centre recently described as:

...possibly the worst piece of public policy since, in 1935, the Government entomologist decided to introduce the cane toad into Australia.

The Bankwest Curtin Economics Centre has written <u>a BCEC Briefing Note</u> that analyses the significance of student debt and advocates for policy reform to support our younger generations and reduce intergenerational inequity in the years to come.

New skills for the future of work - World Economic Forum

These could be foundation skills required in all staff in the near future.

 Carbon Intelligence - Carbon intelligence has quickly risen in importance, driven by growing urgency around climate change and a torrent of environmental regulations worldwide, from Singapore to California. Organizations are expected to track, report and mitigate the environmental impact of their operations



and supply chains with greater frequency and consistency than ever before.

- Virtual Intelligence The second pillar of the new skills triad is <u>virtual</u> intelligence - the ability to work effectively across digitally mediated environments, including full-time office environments. This skill set has become indispensable for anyone collaborating with clients, colleagues, or partners across time zones, geographies and platforms. In other words, nearly everyone in the modern workplace.
- 3. Al proficiency The third and most widely heralded skill in the triad is Al proficiency. While few will become machine learning engineers, most knowledge workers will still need to understand how to integrate AI tools into their daily workflows. Just as not everyone had to become a software engineer to benefit from and gain internet proficiency, the same is true with AI.

Employers' experience of young job applicants

The Employers' experience of young job applicants research found that employers valued the right attitude, good communication skills and relevant experience most.

Key findings include:

- 58% of employers reported having young applicants (aged between 15 to 24 years) in the last 12 months.
- 82% of employers who had applications from young people ended up hiring at least one young person.
- Medium and large businesses were more likely to have a successful young applicant than the small ones.
- Only 18% of businesses accessed programmes and subsidies when taking on young applicants.





Employment Statistics

Australian Bureau of Statistics Employment Data for April

- unemployment rate remained at 4.1%. (3.8% in WA)
- participation rate remained at 67.0% (68.9% in WA)
- employment increased to 14,622,100.
- employment to population ratio remained at 64.3%. (66.3% in WA).
- underemployment rate increased to 6.0% (5.4% in WA)
- youth unemployment remained at 8.9%

Jobs and Skills Recruitment Insights

April 2025 Internet Vacancy Report - 4.5% increase

Australia's job market saw a 4.5% increase in online job advertisements last month (seasonally adjusted). Job ads increased across all Major Occupation groups, with Professionals seeing the strongest increase. Increases were also recorded across all skill levels, and states and territories.

Bringing Care Home: Softening demand for Aged and Disabled Carers may not signal easing workforce pressures

Internet Vacancy Index results suggest recent easing in demand for Aged and Disabled Carers; however, job advertisement numbers remain high relative to historical results, particularly outside capital cities.

*There were salary increases for Aged Care Workers on 1 January, and the next pay rise is scheduled for 1 October. There is ongoing pressure for further wage increases for Aged Care workers.

Bankwest Curtin Economics Centre Labour Market Update – April 2025



Almost 90,000 additional jobs generated in April with women accounting for the majority of the additional employment.

Estimates from the labour force survey undertaken in April show an increase in employment of 89,000 jobs from the previous month. Around two-thirds of that increase was in full-time jobs (59,500). Women accounted for most of the additional employment (up 65,300 jobs), and of the growth in full-time positions (+42,200 jobs).

Despite the surge in employment, the national unemployment rate continues to hover between 4.0 per cent and 4.1 per cent.

\$58 million for Fee Free TAFE and Apprenticeships

The State Government's Fee-Free TAFE initiative experienced a surge in enrolments last year. The overall increase in publicly funded enrolments, grew from about 130,000 in 2016 to a new record high of about 165,000 in 2024.

- Of the qualifications available through the initiative, the largest percentage growth in enrolments for 2024 was in building and construction, with a massive 263 per cent increase in Certificate IV in Building and Construction enrolments.




Creative WA: 10 Year vision

The Creative WA strategic plan aims to grow a creative ecosystem in our cities and regions.

The goals include:

 Grow and strengthened the creative workforce, including clearer entry points and pathways, *more affordable education and training opportunities*, more regional practitioners able to sustain careers in their areas, and more practitioners remaining or coming into Western Australia.



Comment: If the cost of creative courses in the VET sector became fee free across the State, clearer entry points and pathways would become immediately apparent.

• Increased permanent and temporary spaces fit-for-purpose for making and presenting creative, cultural and arts work.

Comment: This looks like investment in the construction industry rather than in creative industries. (See the latest news on the Film Studios <u>HERE</u>.) With the creation of the new Department of Creative Industries, Tourism and Sport, there is a risk that strategies for creative industries will not be a priority.

• Increased young people reporting active encouragement and clearer pathways for creative learning, engagement and careers.

Comment: I imagine "active encouragement" could include funding for artists in residence and jobs for creative artists across Western Australia.

Students' career aspirations do not reflect education plans of labour market demands, says OECD

While educational aspirations are higher than ever, <u>this report</u> reveals that too many teenagers, particularly in Australia, are unclear, unprepared, and uninformed about their future career options and the pathways required to achieve them.

Key findings from Australia include:

- 36% of Australian students are "career uncertain", meaning they are unable to clearly identify a job they expect to work in by age 30. This mirrors a rising trend across OECD nations (39%) and is associated with poorer employment outcomes later in life.
- 66% of Australian students expect to work in high-status professional roles, such as doctors, lawyers, and engineers, double the actual labour market demand for these positions. This figure is among the highest across OECD countries.
- Only 34% of students had completed an internship or work placement, and just 45% had participated in a workplace visit or job shadowing, despite strong evidence that these activities lead to better long-term job outcomes.

The OECD warns that the economic and social costs of inaction are significant: persistent skills shortages, declining workforce participation, and young people at risk of becoming NEET (Not in Education, Employment, or Training).

CICA Response

"This report is a wake-up call," said David Carney, Executive Director of the Career Industry Council of Australia (CICA). "We're seeing young Australians with incredible potential fall through the cracks, not because they lack ambition, but because they lack access to the right guidance, information, and exposure to the full range of career possibilities."

"The message is simple," said Mr Carney. "We need to stop treating career guidance as an optional extra and start recognising it as a national investment in our future prosperity."
