The Big Day In careers in IT show

Each year the <u>Australian Computer Society</u> hosts a road show that goes around Australia trying to attract students into careers in computing.




This year The Big Day In was on at Curtin.

My main takeaways were:

Many of the speakers had started in careers in other industries before going into IT.

 Jennifer Rule was poached by <u>Iluka Resources</u> from lecturing in the <u>Fashion and Design department at</u>
 South Metro TAFE.

She said that she had practically none of the essential criteria on the job description but said her transferrable skills were perfect and she landed the job.



There were three guys who had won cadetships in the <u>Bankwest Technology</u>
 <u>Graduate Program</u> and only one, Bharath Sukesh, had gone straight from school, where he loved maths and straight sciences, into a Bachelor of Engineering where he specialised in Computer Science.



Of the other two, Dylan Travers started off his career doing architecture before going into software engineering, and Ryan Thuys started doing fashion and design before moving into social media and finally software engineering.

PATHWAYS FROM SCHOOL INTO IT

- The <u>Australian Signals Directorate</u> used to be spy central. It offers the
 <u>Australian Government Digital Apprentice Program</u> and if you worked there,
 your training would be first class as you can't really afford to make mistakes
 in this line of work. You can find a great career quiz that indicates what sort

- Women in Technology WA provides ongoing mentoring, events and support.


Eurovision superstars Voyager gave a free concert at Kelmscott SHS this month and were blown away by the talent of the school's specialist music students.



Pathways to VET for those without their WACE or OLNA

There are several alternative pathways to TAFE for school students who do not achieve an OLNA.

- Vocational pathway (VET in schools): students can achieve an OLNA or a Certificate I, II or III to gain entry to a TAFE course.
- TAFE Admissions testing: school students
 may be eligible to register for TAFE
 Admissions testing if they have not sat the
 OLNA at school within the six months
 preceding TAFE Admissions testing and if
 they have not exhausted their maximum six attempts



they have not exhausted their maximum six attempts at the OLNA while of compulsory school age.

- Alternative assessment:
 - o Students can enrol at any Certificate I level, as there are no entry and
 - Students can enrol into one of the foundation skills and equity courses.
