Dear Parishioners, This Wednesday, is Ash Wednesday it marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is season of serious Prayers, Fasting and Almsgiving. Several Masses will be celebrated on Wednesday at 9.30am, 2.15pm, 5.30pm & 7.30pm at St Agatha's Church and 2.30pm at St Therese's School, during which Ashes will be distributed. This is not a holy day of obligation; however, it is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat. Catholics who have completed their 18th year and have not yet begun their 60th year are obliged to Fast. In addition, all Catholics who have completed their 18th year and have not receive the Ashes on Wednesday.
