
ACER Independent School Scholarship Applications Open

Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) scholarships are granted to academically outstanding students by independent schools across Australia. Tests are generally run in February and March to identify scholars for the following year.

You can find a list of schools that grant the scholarships when you register HERE.

There are two categories to apply for:

1. Primary Tests for entry into Years 4 - 6



2. Secondary for entry into Years 7 - 12



There are <u>25 participating schools</u> in WA and they all run the test at a date that suits their school's schedule.

Employment Statistics and Trends

Australian Bureau of Statistics - September figures

- Labour force figures for September showed the **unemployment rate rising** from 4.2 per cent to 4.5 per cent for the month in seasonally adjusted figures.
- The number of people employed rose by 15,000 in September, but the number of unemployed people rose by 34,000 so more people have entered the market for jobs resulting in a rise in unemployment numbers.

Recruitment Insights Report for September

The recruitment rate is continuing to trend upward, while recruitment difficulty continues a downward trend over the past year. This positive sentiment is also reflected in the long-term outlook, with more employers expecting to increase staff over the coming year

In September 2025, the **national recruitment rate increased by 1 percentage point** to 51%. This move continues an upward trend with the national recruitment rate increasing by 6 percentage points over the past 12 months.

Recruitment Difficulty The recruitment difficulty rate increased by 5 percentage points in September to 45% of recruiting employers. Despite this monthly increase, the rate remains 7 percentage points lower than it was a year ago and 30 percentage points below the record high of 75% in July 2022. See the September report HERE.

Internet Vacancy Report September

In seasonally adjusted terms, job advertisements increased by 2.3% (or 4,700 job advertisements) in September 2025 to stand at 207,700. Vacancy numbers continue at elevated levels, with around 20% more advertisements in the labour market presently than compared with the monthly average for 2019.

The monthly Vacancy Report includes spotlights on key facets of the Australian labour market. These bring together the wider breadth of data produced by Jobs and Skills Australia and our external stakeholders to provide an overarching summary of a particular labour market segment.

Bankwest Curtin Economics Centre September Labour Market Update

- Anaemic jobs growth in September sees unemployment rate rise to 4.5 per cent
- Participation remains high despite weakening labour market conditions



There's now no disputing that the national labour market is softening. The question is how sharp the downturn will be and how long it will last.

September saw just 14,900 net additional jobs created across the country.

By comparison, around 25,000 additional jobs would have been required to keep the unemployment rate steady, had there been no change in participation.

Despite the weakening labour market, the participation rate increased 0.1ppt to 67 per cent, back near the record high 67.2 per cent set in January of this year.

QLD, SA, and WA actually recorded strong jobs growth for the month: 0.5 per cent, 0.5 per cent, and 0.4 per cent, respectively.

Annual Occupation Shortage List 2025

Jobs and Skills Australia has released the annual Occupation Shortage List (OSL), showing an easing in labour market conditions. In 2025, 29% of occupations were in national shortage, down from 33% in 2024 and 36% at the peak in 2023.

This improvement reflects:

- more qualified applicants entering the workforce
- higher vacancy fill rates and falling recruitment difficulty rates
- softer demand from employers.

Challenges remain


Despite the pressure easing, nearly half of trade roles and two in five professional occupations are still in shortage, particularly in health, education and construction. These gaps are weighing on industries already facing below-average productivity growth.

Digging deeper

Released alongside the OSL, the <u>Occupation Shortage Drivers</u> identify the primary causes of shortages, including:

- insufficient qualified applicants, especially in health, teaching and construction
- gaps in employability skills and experience (among high-skilled professionals),
 even among qualified candidates
- low pay, poor conditions and retention challenges driving shortages in care and service roles.







Training News

One Free Qualification



Warning: School students do not have to pay VET fees. There are fee free courses available for people who have left school but there are lots of courses that are NOT fee free.

If you have done a Certificate III at school, the government will not cover any fees that apply to a Cert III VET course after you finish school.

⇒ Check with your training provider: Check with your training provider for information about specific courses and fees. There may be a free course that will get you on the path to a career in your chosen field. Get expert advice on fees, including resources costs at a Jobs and Skills Centre.

Resources Fees Vary between Training Providers



Whether your course offers free or paid tuition fees, you will have to pay for your resources. In a course like Commercial Cookery, the fee differences can be significant. It is worth taking the time to compare costs between training providers.

NCVER: Apprentices and Trainees for March Quarter 2026

National Council for Vocational Education Research (NCVER)

On 31 March 2025, there were 320,830 active (in-training) apprentice and trainee contracts nationally, with over two-thirds in trade occupations. The total number of in-training contracts decreased by 7.9% from 31 March 2024. Trade contracts decreased by 3.2%, to 230,145, while non-trade contracts declined by 17.9%, to 90,665.

Trade occupations

Compared with the March quarter 2024:

Commencements declined by 1.8%. The largest declines were among Construction
Trades Workers (down 350, or by 4.2%, to 8,055), and Automotive and Engineering
Trades Workers (down 300, or by 3.0%, to 9,770). Commencements increased for
Electrotechnology and Telecommunications Trades Workers (up 200, or by 2.6%, to
7,925), accounting for 24.7% of commencing trade contracts.

Non-Trade occupations

Compared with the March quarter 2024:

- Commencements decreased by **14.1%** overall, continuing a general downward trend since the March guarter 2022.
 - The largest decreases were among Sales Workers (down 1,095, or 44.6%, to 1,360), and
 - Clerical and Administrative Workers (down 895, or by 20.4%, to 3,500)

Numbers doing School Based Training increase

NCVER VET in Schools Analysis of 2024

In 2024, the number of students participating in vocational education and training (VET) in Schools increased by 5.8%, reaching a total of 266 765 students in Australia, compared with 2023. This represents an estimated 27.8% of the school population aged 15 to 19 years in Australia.

VET in Schools students undertaking training package qualifications were primarily enrolled in:

- Sport, fitness and recreation (14.8%) and
- Business services (14.0%) training packages.

School-based apprenticeships were predominantly in

- Business services (16.1%) and
- Community services (11.9%).


School Students in VET reaches highest level since collection began in 2006

National Council of Vocational Education and Training Research

Queensland has the highest proportion of VET in Schools students (39.4%). In 2024 over a quarter of students aged 15 – 19 took part in VET programs as part of their senior secondary schooling.

- The most popular training package was Tourism, Travel and Hospitality (56,740 or 15.5%), followed by Sport, Fitness and Recreation (50,700 or 13.8%), and Business Services (42,120 or 11.5%).
- Completions in Certificate II in Electrotechnology (Career Start) have grown significantly.

Women in Non-Traditional Trades Scholarship

WiNTT will provide 400 scholarships to women, with 100 to be provided, to undertake training at WA TAFE colleges in non-traditional trades over the next four years. Scholarships to a value of \$5,000 each will be available for women enrolling in an eligible qualification (either part time or full time) or an apprenticeship or traineeship; with 20 scholarships available through each WA TAFE college.

The \$5,000 payment will help to cover costs such as student fees, learning resources, tools, work clothes and personal protective equipment, work tickets and licences, transport, accommodation and childcare.

Scholarship recipients will also benefit from tailored mentoring and support services to help them to complete their qualification and successfully transition into employment in their chosen industry.



- choose law or a combined law degree as any preference on TISC, or apply for your chosen law course <u>directly on the Murdoch website</u>

This pathway involves a half-day workshop, including a written assessment. The written assessment tests your skills and ability for studying law. It is used as a basis for admission, instead of your overall ATAR score or selection rank.

If you successfully complete the course and meet all eligibility requirements, you will receive an offer to study a Bachelor of Laws or a combined Law degree at Murdoch University.

Absence from ATAR written examinations

Candidates who experience illness or a misadventure on the day of their ATAR course written examination must submit a *Sickness/Misadventure application* form to the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (the Authority). This form is available under the 'Examinations' accordion on the Authority website at https://scsa.wa.edu.au/forms/forms.opens in new window.

ATAR course written examinations late arrival

All ATAR course written examination candidates must arrive at the examination centre at least 30 minutes prior to the prescribed examination start time. The prescribed start time for morning examination sessions is 8.50 am and 1.30 pm for afternoon sessions.

Supervisors will instruct candidates to enter the examination room approximately 20 minutes before the prescribed start time so that administrative procedures can occur and important examination instructions can be explained.

Candidates will not be permitted to enter the examination room after the first half an hour of working time. For all Mathematics course examinations, candidates will not be permitted to enter the examination room after the initial 30 minutes of *Section One:* calculator free working time.


