They will explore contemporary, modern and traditional artists and movements, and view and discuss characteristics of their own and others' art works.

Prep

In Term 4, Prep artists will:

- Present and discuss their artwork at the Art Show
- Learn about Vincent Van Gogh and use watercolour to paint sunflowers
- Develop textile and thread skills by weaving a blanket for Christmas elves in celebration of the festive season
- Develop visual thinking skills by interpreting and responding to a wide range of artworks

Year 1

In Term 4, Year 1 artists will:

- Present and discuss their artwork at the Art Show
- Construct a recycled art garden using found materials
- Explore the art of collage focusing on the elements of shape, colour and balance
- Use ink daubers and watercolour paint to create Christmas snowmen in celebration of the festive season
- Develop visual thinking skills by interpreting and responding to a wide range of artworks

Year 2

In Term 4, Year 2 artists will:

- Present and discuss their artwork at the Art Show
- View and discuss artwork by the Tjanpi desert weavers and create yarn wrapped animals
- Practise printmaking skills using the stamping technique to create Christmas pine artworks in celebration of the festive season
- Practise visual thinking skills by interpreting and responding to a wide range of artworks



Year 3

In Term 4, Year 3 artists will:

- Present and discuss their artwork at the Art Show
- Develop intaglio printmaking skills and produce floral motifs focusing on the element of line
- Create a Christmas collage inspired by Henri Matisse's cutouts
- Practise visual thinking skills by interpreting and responding to a wide range of artworks

Year 4

In Term 4, Year 4 artists will:

- Present and discuss their artwork at the Art Show
- Learn about line reduction printmaking to create pop art inspired prints
- Explore the batik technique to create Christmas snowflakes in celebration of the festive season
- Practise visual thinking skills by interpreting and responding to a wide range of artworks

Year 5

In Term 4, Year 5 artists will:

- Present and discuss their artwork at the Art Show
- Develop printmaking skills and produce a collagraph print focusing on shape and composition
- Draw and paint Christmas themed jars in celebration of the festive season
- Practise visual thinking skills by interpreting and responding to a wide range of artworks



Year 6

In Term 4, Year 6 artists will:

Use symbolism to represent ideas, memories and feelings through art. They
will view and discuss works by contemporary street artists, and use their
research as inspiration for skateboard deck artworks. The deck artworks
will communicate ideas, thoughts and feelings about their time in primary
school and their future as secondary school students. The decks will be
displayed at the Year 6 graduation ceremony.
