- 3. To create an environment that enables students to be resilient, connected and confident learners, while embracing the diversity of others


- 4. To embed a culture of cohesion, consistency and collaboration amongst all staff

School Improvement Surveys (Data from 2019-2023)

- Historic data showed an unhappiness within the school community (parents, students and staff)
- Data from this year's survey showed a significant improvement across all areas.
 - Surveys completed by 100% staff, 96% students (Y5-6), 29% of families
