Internet of Things IoT Bachelor of Computer Science (Honours)

Computer scientists are problem solvers and innovators.

Throughout this specialised four-year [Bachelor of Computer Science \(Honours\)](#) course, students will develop the knowledge and practical skills required to design and develop innovative software solutions to address multifaceted information and technology challenges. They will have access to specialised facilities, including dedicated robotics, cyber security and augmented and virtual reality laboratories, all supported by experienced, industry-connected staff.

Importantly, students will have the opportunity to *undertake a professional placement* as part of their studies, or work in teams with an industry partner to tackle authentic business challenges as part of a capstone project.



Internet of Things IoT Bachelor of Computer Science (Honours)

Similarly to Deakin University, Swinburne University also offers [Bachelor of Computer Science \(Honours\)](#) with a major in the *Internet of Things*.

With a focus on software development, this course is taught by some of the best computer minds in the business. Students learn in industry standard labs and choose to specialise with a major in *Artificial Intelligence, Cyber security, Data Science, Games Development, Software Development* or *Internet of Things*.

The *Internet of Things* major gives students the core skills needed to program a host of devices and develop software solutions. They learn to problem-solve through analysing data from internet-connected devices.

Worth noting, this course includes a guaranteed Work Integrated Learning opportunity, which could be a placement, internship or industry-linked project.



Camp SEEK 2026

Camp SEEK is a four-day immersive daily learning program for Year 9 and 10 girls and non-binary students. Spend four action-packed days at SEEK HQ in Melbourne learning about careers in technology, developing coding, design and product practical skills, exploring real-world problem solving and pitching with your fellow Camp SEEKers.

The technology industry is not as diverse as it could be. There is a shortage of women and non-binary talent in STEM school subjects, at the tertiary level and in the workforce. As a leading technology company, SEEK champions diversity within its industry and its own talent pipeline, and Camp SEEK is a favourite, and most fun, program. It is designed to increase the number of girls and non-binary students who choose to pursue a career in technology.

News from the University of Tasmania

➤ **Schools Recommendation Program**

The University of Tasmania's ***Schools Recommendation Program*** is a program allowing Australian Year 12 students to apply for up to five courses and receive a conditional offer before the final results are released.

So, rather than only the ATAR, the application is based on a student's school recommendation and their Year 11 results. It has been designed to give students confidence in completing their Year 12 and receiving a university place in 2027.

Applications open 25 June 2026, and there are a number of application rounds, and applications can be submitted right up to 5 October 2026.

Note: students who apply by 27 July 2026 will be eligible for Round One offers from 3 September. Applicants will be notified of their success after UTAS has received the recommendation from their school.

➤ **Medicine Applications for 2027 Entry**

Domestic applications for [Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine](#) open on 1 August and close on 30 September 2026. All applicants require a valid UCAT ANZ score. Groups of applicants with the same ATAR will be ranked by using the UCAT ANZ score as a secondary ranking method.



Accelerated Bachelor of Education (Primary)

Did you know you can achieve a four-year equivalent qualification in only three years of full-time study if you undertake selected units in Trimester 3?

Deakin University offers the ***Bachelor of Education (Primary)*** at its Burwood, Waurin Ponds, and Warrnambool campuses. This degree has been developed and reviewed with input from professional educators and the education sector, meaning students' learning is highly relevant to their future teaching careers. Students gain confidence under the expert guidance of experienced staff who are recognised leaders and innovators in their fields.

Students get to choose a specialisation and develop advanced skills in a priority area of the primary curriculum, such as:

- health and physical education
- humanities
- English
- mathematics
- science
- the arts.

Of note is that this course can be fast-tracked over three years if students undertake units in Trimester 3.

Career as a Biomedical Engineer

The Good Universities Guide* states that *Biomedical Engineers apply engineering and scientific methods to find solutions to problems in medicine and the life sciences.*

Biomedical Engineers fulfil a number of tasks including –

- *Designing new medical monitoring, diagnostic and therapeutic equipment*
- *Setting up and maintaining medical equipment*
- *Plan data processing services and the development of associated computing programs*
- *Analyse new medical procedures to forecast likely outcomes*
- *Participate in medical or scientific procedures where biomedical skills are needed*
- *Design and deliver technology to assist people with disability*
- *Analyse and design prosthetic and orthotic devices*

To become a Biomedical Engineer, students usually have to complete an engineering degree at university with a major in biomedical engineering.

Two universities in Victoria offering a Biomedical Engineering specialisation are:

[Monash University](#) - students are equipped with strong clinical, technical and regulatory foundations in professional biomedical engineering practice, taught by leading academics in physiology, anatomy, molecular biology, materials science, electrical, mechanical and chemical engineering.

[RMIT](#) - students develop the knowledge and skills they need to undertake a career that helps people affected by health conditions and the health professionals who support them. They complete studies in biomechanics, medical electronics, mathematics and engineering science, and are well-trained to work in the vibrant and expanding medical technology and biotechnology industries, producing assistive technologies, medical devices for rehabilitation applications, lab-on-a-chip diagnostics and biomaterials.

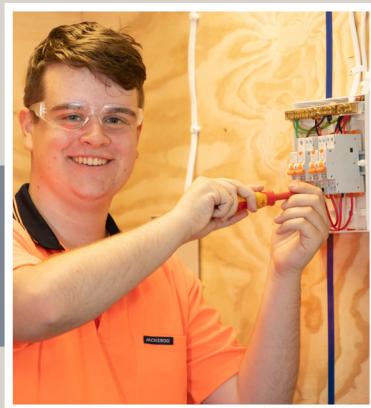
