




YEAR 10 - CAREER EXPLORATION

Last week, all Year 10 students commenced their Career Investigator Plan in preparation for choosing VCE studies, VET and/or VCAL next year. The Career Investigator asked the students to research 3 different career choices/occupations (Plan A, Plan B and Plan C) and record what they discovered about each one. Prior to these lessons, the students were asked to complete a Career Voyage Program which is an internationally recognised, high quality career planning system. After completing a series of questions, the Career Voyage program generated an Occupational Interest Profile, 20+ Job Suggestions ranked in order of suitability, detailed Job information, Qualification Requirements plus more.

By using the Career Investigator tool, the students were able to start clarifying their goals and begin taking steps to map their future. The House Coordinators, and other staff involved in the subject selection interviews next term, will use some of this information to guide their advice to students.
